

This would be a good opportunity for someone to volunteer and transition into the editorship without a lot of undue hardship.

DUES DELAYED UNTIL JANUARY 1996

We will not collect dues until the end of the year. Anyone who has prepaid the upcoming year will get credit for it. Delaying the collection of dues will give us an opportunity to recruit an editor and move to a calendar year basis for dues. We are also considering a multiple year structure giving individuals a slight reduction for paying more than one year at a time.

U.S. NEW ISSUE -- CORRECTION

The United States Postal Service (USPS) will issue a booklet in May 1995 consisting of five recreational sports. [The format of the recreational sports stamps has been changed to a pane of 20 instead of a booklet of 20.]

The stamps and uncacheted first day covers can be ordered direct from the USPS, Philatelic Fulfillment Service Center, Box 449997, Kansas City, MO 64144-9997. All orders have a \$10.00 minimum purchase and 50 cent service charge (for up to 500 stamps). The Center will accept credit cards by fax at 1-816-545 1212. [The service charge has been raised to \$3.00 per order.]

However, if any of our overseas members wish, I will be happy to mail the panes for face value plus postage or \$7.50. The cost of the pane is \$6.40 and the international postage is \$.95 for the first ounce. The panes will be available from the USPS for several months. While I will mail out the orders received to date, others might want to purchase single stamps rather than the pane consisting of four stamps of each design.

VARIATIONS ON A THEME

I am often asked, "What constitutes a golf stamp?" My answer is "That's up to the collector." Its not a smart answer. Its real, especially in a topical collection. Over ninety worldwide issues could be called golf stamps, but are they? Included in that number are stamps showing golf courses, former golf courses, golfers, people supposed to be playing at golf, equipment that is supposed to be golf, cars called "Golf" and seem to be golfers in other attire. You choose where you want your collection to start and stop.

Mildred Didrickson (Later to be known as Babe Didrickson Zaharias) is on a January 24, 1957 Dominican Republic stamps commemorating the 1956 Olympics. She is a hurdler. Some people - including myself - have this issue in their collection. It is felt that the Scott number 474-478 surface mail stamps and C97-C99 air mail stamps are part of the complete Didrickson Collection. (She is on C99) A golf collector need only C99-if they choose to even put the issue in their collection. A philatelic golf collector should have all eight, but the personal decision does not stop her since the issue comes perforated and imperforated. So do the souvenir sheets; if you are adding them to your collection. Now all four items can be found on First Day Covers if you want them also.

This issue is a perfect example of how far a single issue can go. It was overprinted twice. The first was the Red Cross Hungarian Relief overprint, February 18, 1957. The issue's Scott number was B1-B5 for the surface mail stamps and CB1-CB3 (She is on CB3) air mail stamps. It was perforated only. However the souvenir sheets was perforated and imperforated. The issue and souvenir sheets are on First Day Covers. But there was one final overprint commemorating the Third Pan-Am Games. It was issued September 10, 1959 in the imperforated format only. The Scott numbers are B26-B30 for the surface mail and B16-B18 (She is on B-18) air mail. Therewere no souvenir sheets. There were First Day Covers.


There are four ways this Mildred Didrickson stamp is available, plus as many souvenire sheets. Is your collection complete with just C-99?



GOLF DUBAI


Hansjorg Medvejsek (Edited by Stuart R. MacKenzie)





Hansjorg Medvejsek of Germany has recently discovered a new 'Golf' stamp from the United Arab Emirates. It is, the 1DH value from the 1991 issue of the 1st Anniversary of the Death if Shaikh Rashid bin Said al-Maktoum (Ruler of Dubai) It depicts 'Modern and Old' buildings - the modern being the 'Golf Club House' of the Emirates Golf Club Dubai - a venue for the Volvo Furopean Golf Tour - The European P.G.A. Desert Classic.

From a recent brochure I have managed to illustrate the Club House, golf courses and a fact sheet. As can be seen a very luxurious facility for its members.




I have also spoken to the Architect, Mr John Mills the Senior Partner of Brewer Smith and Brewer, London, who were commissioned to design the Club House. Mr Mills informs me that the design was a combination of the 'Bedouin' tent, and the striped cornice was taken from the band in their head dress. Further extansions are going ahead and the 9 hole golf course is being extended to 18 holes.

1995 OPEN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP THE OLD COURSE, ST ANDREWS

The Open Golf Championship returns to St.Andrews and will be played for the 25th time over The Old Course Links - a 'Silver Jubilee' of Opens.

The Open Championship was first played at St.Andrews in 1873 and was won by Tom Kidd, since that the names of the past winners are some of the greatest that the game has known.



GLASGOW POSTAL G.C. v. EDINBURGH ELECTRIC G.C.

On 23rd June 1995 The Glasgow Postal G.C. will play the Edinburgh Electric G.C. for the 'Massie Trophy' (see below) at Stirling G.C. This special 'Centenary Match' will comprise 24 players each side with 12 Four Ball Matches.

To commemorate this 'Centenary Match' a special handstamp will be used on the day (see opposite)

The unusual title of Edinburgh Electric G.C. came about last Century due to their being an Edinburgh Postal G.C. 'Electric' being used as a more 'dynamic' title! The Massie Trophy was presented by George Massie of the Edinburgh Postal District in 1912 for annual competition between Glasgow and Edinburgh Postal Clubs. The value of the Trophy is £6000.


