## The Stamp of Greatness

RANCIS OUIMET will become the third American golfer to appear on a United States postage stamp, joining Robert Tyre Jones, Jr., and Mildred (Babe) Didrikson Zaharias. The stamp will be issued on June 13, 1988, timed to coincide with the opening practice round of the United States Open, at The Country Club, in Brookline, Massachusetts.

Ouimet occupies an important niche in the story of American golf. He was a 20-year-old amateur when, in 1913, he defeated Harry Vardon and Ted Ray, two fine British professionals, in a playoff at The Country Club for the Open Championship.

Ouimet's victory helped to popularize golf in our nation. He was the second homebred to win (John McDermott, the first, won in 1911 and 1912). Ouimet won the United States Amateur Championship in 1914, and in 1931, 17 years later, he won the Amateur again. It was the longest time span for an individual between victories in the history of the Amateur.

He also played on eight United States Walker Cup Teams against the British and Irish side, beginning with the first of these International Matches, in 1922. He played subsequently in 1923, 1924, 1926, 1928, 1930, 1932, and 1934. He served as Playing Captain in 1932 and 1934, and Captain in 1936, 1938, 1947, and 1949 (the Walker Cup was suspended during the Second World War).



## COLONEL BOGEY

Dealing mainly in Scottish Postal History, as well as Philatelic Golf. A sideline is philatelic material that has a Scottish connection which is collected quite widely throughout the World. One such item which caught my eye at the beginning of this year, was the cover illustrated below. These special event covers usually have a printed card as what we call a stiffener, (no, not' Boozé!) where details of what the cover is commemorating are printed. On reading it I came across an interest -ing piece of information that our readers might find amusing.





## KENNETH J. ALFORD

The association's between the Royal Marines and the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders are known to many. Firstly when the 93rd Highlanders and the Royal Marines defended the heights above Balaklava during the Crimean War, secondly a Battalion served with the Royal Marine Division in 1940 and later the 'Plymouth Argylls' hastily formed to defend Singapore in 1942. However few people realise that these strong associations were personalised by Kenneth J. Alford, the pen-name of Major F.J. Ricketts RM — a Bandmaster in the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders before he became a Director of Music in the Royal Marines. Born one hundred years ago on 21st February 1881, he enlisted in the Royal Irish Regiment in September 1895, giving his date of birth as 5th March 1880 in order to achieve the 15½ years of age necessary to enable him to commence his musical career. After serving with his regiment in India he was selected for the Royal Military School of Music at Kneller Hall in 1904. Soon after being appointed Bandmaster of the 2nd Battalion, The Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders in 1908, his commanding Officer asked him to compose a march dedicated to his new regiment, with the result that 'The Thin Red Line' was written — the title referring to the nickname given to the regiment recalling their gallant stand at Balaklava. His best know march was written in 1913 when Ricketts composed 'Colonel Bogey' after hearing an impatient golfer trying to attract the attention of someony standing on the fairway by repeatedly whistling the two notes C and A. During his early years with the Argylls he wrote a number of marches, 'Holyrood', 'The Vedette' and 'The Mad Major', being amongst them and the First World War inspired not only 'The Voice of the Guns', 'The Great Little Army' and 'Cavalry of the Clouds', but surprisingly, whilst he was serving in the Army, 'The Middy' and 'On the Quarterdeck'. In 1919 he composed his moving poetic march, 'The Vanished Army', which has so often been heard at the Festival of Remembrance and at the

### BOGEY

As early as the 1880s some courses in England were assigning a standard stroke score to each hole. This represented the score a good amateur should make if he committed no major errors. About 1890 or 1891 a Maj. Charles Wellman who was playing at Great Yarmouth — remarked that the standard score was a "Regular Bogey Man" referring to the current music hall hit 'Hush, hush, hush, here comes the Bogey Man. He'll catch you if he can', The Secretary of the club (Dr Thomas Browne, RN) thereupon adopted the name of Bogey as a personification of the demon golfer who played perfectly. He was later playing at the United Services Club, at Alverstoke (members all officers of Navy and Army) and introduced this imaginary player. Captain S. Vidal of the Royal Engineers insisted such a player must be a Commanding Officer andso Bogey became Colonel Bogey. This undoubtedly was the source for the name of the March of the same name written by Major Ricketts in 1913 — if the story of its origin is true.

## THE ILLUSTRATED COMMEMORATIVE COVERS OF THE OPEN

The first commemorative cover to be produced was that for the 1968 Open at Carnoustie. The basic cover was used for each of the four days play, with a postmark for each day. The other exceptions were both from Opens played over 'The Old Course' - 1970 Open where the basic cover was used during the four days play, plus the famous 'Play Off' on the Sunday. In the 1978 Open, two handstamps were used for the first day and the last. Other than the above, a single handstamp has been is use until now.





































## JAPANESE SCENIC DATESTAMPS

Postal datestamps incorporating designs related to scenic spots or historic sites are known as scenic datestamps. They are used to publicize a locality rather than to commemorate a special event. The datestamp remains in use for extended periods of time — until a post office is renamed or a new pictorial design authorized. Some have been in use over 30 years.

Scenic datestamps are generally 36mm indiameter and can be applied to letters or postcards bearing the current letter or postcard rate. These pictorial datestamps are in continuous daily usage, but only applied upon request. They may be requested for handback service or postal usage. In cases where no commemorative datestamp is provided for a new issue, the preferred cancellation is a scenic datestamp of a place somehow related to the stamp design.

The datestamps contain the postoffice name, the prefecture in which located, and the date postmarked. The numeral date consists of the year of the Emporor's reign (add 25 years to convert), month and the day.

The first scenic datestamps were introduced in 1931. Preparation of new date stamp designs was discontinued with the advent of war in 1938. Consequently the datestamps are generally categorized as preand post WW II. The post war series of scenic datestamps was begun in 1948.

Golf was featured on four of the prewar datestamps and has been depicted on 16 in the series which began in 1948. The following illustrated list provides the first day of use and location of the post office where in use.

The following illustrated listing of scenic cancellations includes the first day of usage, the post office, and the preference where located.






