

Golf.—The ancient national game of golf continues a favourite amusement, for which the adjacent links are well adapted, so much so, that they have become a place of resort to many of the inhabitants of Edinburgh, who come hither for the purpose of playing this healthful and exhilarating game. A golf club was formed in 1760, and still continues to flourish, consisting of the principal gentlemen of the town and vicinity. A handsome silver cup is annually played for, the winner of which retains possession of it, and is captain of the club for one year, and attaches a gold or silver medal to it before the next competition. The game, from the dryness of the links, can be played at all seasons, and affords to the inhabitants a delightful recreation. It is much to be deplored, however, that an exercise in itself sufficiently stimulating, should frequently be prostituted to the purposes of gambling, and that so many of the young who are employed as cadies or club-carriers, should be initiated in the practices of vice partly from the evil example of those in whose gambling transactions they take a deep interest, and whom they in this respect on a smaller scale ludicrously imitate, and partly from the mistaken liberality of their employers, who, by extravagantly overpaying them for their services, not only furnish them with the means of vicious indulgence, but totally unfit them for the sober and steady industry of any laborious calling.

INTERNATIONAL PHILATELIC GOLF SOCIETY

BY-LAWS

NAME: The official name of this organization shall be the International Philatelic Golf Society (IPGS).

ARTICLE TCLE II PURPOSE: The purposes of the International Philatelic Golf Society shall be to:

A. Further the knowledge of collectors and students of golf philately about their hobby;

B. Disseminate information about golf philately to non-golf philatelists to whet their interest in this topic;
C. Provide opportunities for members to improve their collections by participating in auctions, sales, and informal trading with other members.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Membership in IPGS shall be open to all who are interested in golf philately. Special classes of membership and rates of dues shall be determined by the Board of Directors, as necessary. Applica-tions for membership shall be submitted in writing to the Society Officer designated on the application form, accompanied by dues for the appropriate membership period.
Members not paying their dues within four months of the due date shall be dropped from membership.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS: The Society shall have the following officers:

A. The <u>President</u> shall have general charge of business and affairs of the society, shall preside at any meetings affairs of the society, shall preside at any meetings, shall appoint all committees authorized by the Board of Directors, and shall be an ex-officio member of all such committees.

B. The <u>Vice-President</u> shall serve as aide to the President and shall perform the duties of the President in the President's absence or inability to serve. The Vice-President shall also perform such other duties as delegated by the President.

C. The <u>Secretary</u> shall conduct correspondence relative to the welfare of the Society and shall keep records of membership and meetings of the Society.

D. The <u>Treasurer</u> shall receive all monies in the name of the Society, and pay out monies authorized by proper voucher. The Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of all the Society's finances and submit an annual financial report for publication in the Society's bulletin.

cial report for publication in the Society's bulletin.

E. The <u>Journal Editor</u> shall publish the official journal on a regular basis. Publication in this case refers to compilation, editing, and arranging for printing and distribution of the journal to the membership.

of striction of the journal to the membership.

F. The <u>Auction Fanager</u> shall conduct periodic auctions of philatelic golf material. The Auction Manager is to be a clearing house for material supplied by members and, if feasible, non-members. Auction and sale prices are to be structured in such a way to encourage membership in the Society.

G. The Director(s) shall number between one and three at any given time. Directors shall help promote the Society and serve in any capacity that the President sees fit, other than the duties of the other officers.

The above officers shall constitute the Board of Directors. The term of office shall be three (3) years.

ELECTIONS: Elections shall be conducted by mail ballot, with a majority of the valid votes being cast necessary for election to office. Should only one candidate stand for office or directorship, no ballot for that particular office or directorship is necessary. All members in good standing shall be entitled to one vote for each office or directorship, and must be given a minimum of one month to cast their vote from the time written notification of all candidates is published to the membership.

ARTICLE VI
PUBLICATION: The official journal of the International Philatelic
Golf Society shall be called Tee Time. The publication of any official notice in the journal shall of the Society. The journal is mailed to every member in good standing.

ARTICLE VII ANENDMENTS: The Society's By-laws may be amended at any time by a two-thirds vote of the members voting, providing that notice of the proposed amendment(s) has been sent in writing to each member at least one month in advance.

ROYAL JERSEY GOLF CLUB

On February 28 1978, Jersey issued a set of four stamps commemorating the Centenary of the Royal Jersey Golf Club and honoring Harry Vardon, a World class golfer born on this island in 1870. This set of four stamps are my favorite golf stamps, and led me to wanting to find cut more about them









The Royal Jersey Golf Club, built along Grouville Bay, was founded in 1878 by a Mr F.W. Brewster amongst others. A year later, Her Majesty Queen Victoria granted the Club the title of "Royal".

The course remained virtually unchanged until World War Two, when the Germans occupied the Island. During this period of occupation, the course could not be maintained as usual. The course did retain the professional whose task it was to keep the greens in as good a condit—ion as possible. However, from a beautiful golf course, the Germans transformed the ground into a fortress for the future defense of the Island. Two great block—houses of reinforced concrete were built, cutting into the 2nd. fairway. The mound upon which the eighteenth green is located was littered with machine—gun nests. All the fortifications built were connected by an extensive system of deep trenches covering with camoflaged netting. To protect the coastal areas of the Island, barbed wire was strung across the land and the putting—greens which happened to fall within the wire, became inaccessible and received no more attention until the end of the war.

Adding to the damage was the fact that the course was used as a dumping ground for other materials to be used for the fortifications of other parts of the Island. Material such as the gravel and sand of Grouville Bay, were carried by railway from the beach and dumped onto the course. The Germans found the sand and gravel very well suited for the making of concrete. One pile of this material, running across the golf course and estimated to contain more than a half million tons, was nearly 400 yards long, 50 yards wide, and 25 yards high. Needless to say, the grass on the fairways was ruined. Adding to the destruction - was the fact that the Germans pulled up the water pipes running to the greens using them instead to carry water to their concrete mixers. The course was also used as a firing range and as a training ground for infantry and machine-gun detatchments. In late 1943, the land was mined, being a safe guard against an Allied invasion.

After the Island was liberated, the task of restoring the course was tackled. Lieut-Gen. Sir Edward Grasset, the new Lieut-Governor of Jersey, made P.O.W. labor available to the club. The prisoners tore

down the barbed-wire, cleared minefields, relaid the watering system, and tore up all the railway lines built to transport the sand and the gravel from Grouville Bay. Later when P.O.W. labor was withdrawn, the remainedr of the course restoration rested with the Club. Today, the course is in excellent condition.

Harry Vardon was born at Grouville, Jersey, on May 9th 1870. One of eight children, he was born in a cottage that stood on the edge of the Royal Jersey Golf Club. Vardon first played a form of golfas a boy of seven using sticks and large marbles. Other interests of the young Vardon included cricket, soccer and gardening which was his father's trade. Encouraged by his younger brother Tom's success at golf, Harry decided to have a go at making money playing the game. He took jobs at several different courses before entering the - 1893 British Open at-Prestwick. He didn't do very well in the Open, but a year later ended in fifth place in the Open played at Sandwich. Two years later, in 1896, Vardon won his first British Open played at Muirfiled. He would go on to win 5 more British Opens - 1898 (Prestwick), 1899 (Sandwich) 1903 (Prestwick), 1911 (Sandwich) and 1914 (Prestwick). Harry Vardon's six British Open Championships are a record that stands to this day - though Tom Watson from the United States is but one victory shy of tying Vardons remarkable accomplishment.

I would like to thank those people at Royal Jersey Golf Club who were so kind to answer my request for information about the history of their Club.

The KEITHOCK GOLF CLUB - 1832

Despite having made enquiries through a postal historian in that area, I have been unable to locate the whereabouts of the Golf Course. There is a Keithock House near Brechin (Forfarshire), now Angus and no doubt further research here. One thing sure is that 'The Star Inn' is still to the fore!



GOLF POSTAL STATIONERY



Golf Postal Stationery has been with us since 1921 when Belgium issued a séries of Picture Post Card Stationery (6) for the 'Ostende - Dover' route. This showed a bag of Golf Clubs in the picture. The following year, Belgian Congo issued Picture Post Card stationery items showing-'Le Golf' at Elisabethville, and since these were issued, nine further countries, as far as I know have issued stationery items. In all some 64 items are available, although some of these are now hard to locate.



Over the next few issues of TEE TIME, I hope to record all the types of stationery there is and commence with a selection of the Austrian Postal Stationery. I also show a table giving a detailed listing, using H & G, JPP and Michel Numbering.






