



"COLONEL BOGEY"-postscript

On song at Fortrose!

NOT many people know the part played by Fortrose and Rosemarkie golf course in the composition of the tune "Colonel Bogev".

Apparently, its composer, Bandmaster Ricketts of the 93rd Highlanders, was one of many officers stationed across the water at Fort-George who were honorary members of the golf club. He frequently partnered his colonel in rounds over the course in the pre-World War I days when the term bogey was used for what we would now call the par.

"While playing together one day their attention was drawn by another golfer who whistled from some distance away to attract their attention. The two notes of the whistle

became imprinted in the bandmaster's mind and came to form the opening bar of the famous tune he was later inspired to write and which he entitled 'Colonel Bogey'."



Stamp The Ouimet Commemorative Stamp BY ROBERT M. JENNEY

• fall the ways we honor our heroes, none is more unsung than the ubiquitous postage stamp. It is the most pervasive, most democratic, and most recognized honor that we can give. Pervasive because it is disseminated worldwide; democratic because each is issued in all our names; and most recognized because they are in daily use.

Recognition on stamps is also an honor most difficult to achieve. It must be posthumous by at least a decade, screened by panels of experts, and in competition with other worthy personalities from activities that range over the whole scope of human endeavors."—Herbert Moore Noted Stamp Authority



On June 1st, two weeks before the 1988 U.S. Open Championship, and for four weeks thereafter, posters announcing the issuance of the U.S. Commemorative Stamp honoring Francis D. Ouimet will be exhibited at over 40,000 Post Offices across the nation. 150 million Francis Ouimet Commemorative Stamps will be printed by the U.S. Postal Service. On the afternoon of June 13, the first day of issue, a formal ceremony will be held at the 1988 U.S. Open at The Country Club in Brookline, Massachusetts.

In 1985, at the request of the officers of the Ouimet Scholarship Fund, I accepted the task of spearheading the effort to gain approval for a Commemorative Stamp. I went to Washington to seek the crucial support of House Speaker Tip O'Neill and to ask him to become the stamp's initial sponsor. Speaker O'Neill is both an avid golfer and a serious stamp collector. He was candid in telling me that obtaining approval for the issuance of a Commemorative Stamp would be a very difficult undertaking.

All seven living U.S. Hall of Famers knew Francis Ouimet personally. Their support for a Commemorative Stamp in his honor would serve as convincing evidence that the stamp had strong endorsement at the highest levels of championship golf. It was felt that a formal joint Petition to the U.S. Postmaster General bearing all their signatures would be certain to carry considerable weight in the deliberations of the Postmaster General's Citizen Advisory Committee. To secure the signatures

natures of the legendary Hall of Famers, we enlisted the efforts of Herbert Warren Wind, golf's foremost historian, and a long-standing friend of the seven living Hall of Famers. Herb Wind was devoted to Francis Ouimet.

President Ford agreed enthusiastically to forward the Petition to the U.S. Postmaster General together with his own letter of personal support

The United States Golf Association endorsed our efforts. Frank Hannigan, USGA Executive Director, and Janet Seagle, Museum Curator, were both great Ouimet admirers. We are appreciative of their advice and assistance in this effort.

Stamp collecting is the most popular hobby in the world. There are over 25 million stamp collectors in the United States and legions more overseas. The Postmaster General's Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee has the formidable task of dealing annually with over 20,000 requests for a Commemorative Stamp. Only 24 U.S. Commemorative Stamps are finally approved for issuance each year.

As a result of discussions with others who had been involved in similar efforts we knew that it was crucial that the campaign be sustained at a high level of intensity throughout the long selection process. We were fortunate to gain the support of Vice President Bush whose grandfather. George Herbert Walker, had established the Walker Cup when he was president of The United States Golf Association. The Vice President's father, Senator Prescott Bush, Sr., also served as President of the USGA and had been a close personal friend of Ouimet's. Vice President Bush was helpful in making known to the U.S. Postmaster General his family's long standing ties to the USGA, and his own strong support for a Ouimet commemorative stamp.

Speaker O'Neill arranged for a meeting with Congressman Bill Ford of Michigan. Chairman of the Postal and Civil Service Committee of the House of Representatives. We reviewed with Representative Ford the merits and background of our project and he agreed to lend his backing.

At long last, on April 2, 1987, I received an exciting telephone call from speaker O'Neill telling me he had received word from the U.S. Postmaster General. Preston Robert Tisch, that the issuance of a Francis D. Ouimet Commemorative Stamp had been officially approved! All of us involved in the endeavor were overjoyed to learn that our quest to honor America's First Golf Hero had been successful.

We feel sure that everyone interested in the sport of golf will want to have one or more Limited Edition Official First Day Govers, as shown in the illustration. The First Day of Issue Francis Ouimet Commemorative Stamp Covers will be available by mail order *only during the thirty day period* ending July 13, 1988. Pursuant to U.S. Postal Regulations your mail request for First Day Covers must be postmarked on or before July 13, 1988. To obtain your Commemorative Covers, send a self-addressed envelope with your payment; cone Cover for \$4.00, two Covers for \$6, four Covers for \$10) to the 1988 U.S. Open Office, P.O. Box #1400.
