



The first match was played in 1902, and was decided by aggregate holes. It reverted to single the next year 1903 until 1911.

An interesting point being that the "Walker Cup" which was presented for this match was abandoned in 1932!




The signature hole at Firestone. It has been pivotal in many championships. A 4 can be had here, but it will require three very accurate shots and a good putt.

GOLF SLOGAN POSTMARKS of the UNITED KINGDOM

Part 1

Slogan postmarks are a form of advertising used by the Post Office or a sponsor who pays for the production of a slogan of his choice. They are used during the normal course of machine cancelling.

Slogan postmarks can be made up with a short but catchy message or a picture and in many cases both are used. The main purpose is to get the message through and it is a very effective way of publicity.

In the main 'Slogans' fall into two groups - The General Slogans which commemorate events of Local, National or International importance. Also promotion of campaigns sponsored by - Local Government, Charities and Postal Authorities. Local Publicity highlight local interest of a City, Town and might include holiday places of interest or industrial opportunities.

Slogan postmarks fall into two types - Standard and Transposed and are as follows:







Fig 1. STANDARD

STANDARD when the slogan is impressed to the right of the Town Die as shown in Fig 1.

TRANSPOSED when the slogan is impressed to the left of the Town Die as shown in Fig 2.

In some cases the slogan can be found used in both these formats, but latterly very few slogans have been used in the Standard position.

Town Dies may be found using 'code' letters indicating a certain area or district of a town or city.

The Triangular Surcharge Dies are for use on bulk Printed Matter, and are shown using the Telegraphic Number of the City or Town within the Triangle. The 'S' prefix pertains to Scotland.

NOTE

To differentiate between Standard and Transposed - the letter 'T' will be used after the number designated for the Golf Slogan.

COLLECTING SLOGAN POSTMARKS

Generally slogan postmarks are obtained from two sources - those that are specially prepared for postmarking at the specific office on the First Day of Use. These can be prepared by a stamp dealer, but in the main collectors themselves prepare their own covers and usually obtain a small quantity for future exchange or sale. The second source is commercial mail obtained from firms that accumulate the incoming mail for charity organizations or the collector himself.

The actual slogan can be collected on both full cover or on cut-outs. In some cases the collector actually cuts up the covers to obtain the piece for mounting in his collection thereby saving space - as covers in time become a very bulky collection.

Golf slogans of which there are just less than 100 recorded would be better collected on full cover, although in some instances the cutout piece is most welcome owing to its scarcity or a First Day of Use.

All the Golf slogan postmarks will be featured in a series of articles over the next few issues of TEE TIME. It will give information on the dates of issue and period of useage. The various Town Dies used and Triangular Telegraphic Dies.




POSTCARD CORNER

Card No. 744 dated April 1903








1977 Series of postal stationery envelopes issued showing Golf Clubs and Ball. As shown below in both ordinary and legal size, also with security window panel. Missing color known - awaiting information.



A U.S. postal card was overprinted for the Myrtle Beach Golf Holiday Association of South Carolina. A cachet was added to the front of the ' America the Beautiful ' postal card along with promotional and reservation copy on the reverse. All printing on the post card was done by the Government Printing Office.

The Myrtle Beach Golf Association acts as chamber of commerce for 52 Myrtle Beach golf courses. All national advertising is handled through the association. This advertising campaign was undertaken to relay the message that the Myrtle Beach Golf Courses are still in good shape - even after Hurricane Hugo.

Of the 900,000 cards overprinted, 140,000 will be sold by the philatelic agency to collectors. The remainder were sent out by the Myrtle Beach Association beginning on October 12th to golf enthusiasts across the country.

The postal card is viewed as a first of its kind. Although the U.S. Postal Service has previously overprinted postal cards for International Exhibitions, this is the first produced for a postal customer. It is perceived to be a distinct overprinted variety of the postal card.


