9. Halmstad 5-6 August 1988. PGA Open, one of the professional tournaments on the Swedish golf tour. Winner: V Singh. Emblem of the golf club of Halmstad. Golf course: Tylösand.
10. Drottningholm 3-6 August 1989. Scandinavian Enterprise Open (SEO), one of the professional tournaments on the European Tour. Winner: Ronan Rafferty. You find the golf course Drottningholm just outside Stockholm.
11. Drottningholm 7-10 June 1990. SEO (See no 10). Winner: Craig Stadler, who the final day shot 61 (par 72).
12. Gislaved 16.6. 1990. Co-operative Games. Different events among the companies of Gislaved. The postmark shows golf, bridge and "indoor bandy", a game played in Scandinavia in handball halls with a bended stick and a small ball.

MYRTLE BEACH UPDATE

After Hurricane Hugo hit the coast of South Carolina, the Myrtle Beach Golf Holiday organization wanted to do a mailing to thousands of golfers. The postal card was to inform golfers that even though Hurricane Hugo had hit the area, the Myrtle Beach Golf Courses were still in good shape. The Golf Holiday organization is made up of 52 area golf courses and 68 lodging members which serves as a Chamber of Commerce for golfing.

The 15 cent America the Beautiful card was chosen and 900,000 were over printed for the special mailing. The Golf Holiday organization received 760,000 cards for the mass mailing and the remaining 140,000 were made available through the philatelic sales in Washington, D.C.

Mailing companies were contracted for the bulk - mailing which was made primarily between October 14 and 16. Wanting to send the cards out within a very short timeframe, the cancellation process was bypassed so most of the cards received little evidence of having passed through the mail stream.

LINN'S STAMP NEWS received the cards returned to Myrtle Beach as unable to deliver, address unknown etc. These were sent to collectors on a request basis. These cards have various postal markings indicating that the cards could not be delivered as addressed. It has been interesting to note that many of the cards were sent to Canada shortpaid by 6 cents. However, reportedly very few of these received postage due markings even though they crossed over the Canadian Border twice.

LETTER to the EDITOR

Dear Stuart

Today I received June No. 12 Issue of Tee Time and enjoyed a few moments browsing through it. I guess you have been busy recently? I heard that you were at - STAMP WORLD '90 but regret that we did not meet up. I spent every day on the Hong Kong Stand and was pretty worn out by the time that the Exhibition had run its gamut. I think everyone enjoyed it. I hope you picked up some interesting material there.

In referring back to Tee Time, I noticed that you have let your imagination run riot on Page 143. Unless something has happened since I left St. Kitts which defies all my imagination, the 60c. stamp in the Tourist Issue of 1988 features the Frigate Bay Beach Hotel. It definately is not the 'Clubhouse'. The forth hole is situated very near to the Hotel and the occasional visitor would wander across the 3rd Fairway when returning to the Hotel from a stroll; but he/she would need to scramble over barbed wire fence to gain access to the Hotel's grounds.

To orientate you, the 18th Green is situated just off the stamp, to the left of the bottom left corner of the \$3 stamp. It would be logical to have a clubhouse in that vicinity or just before the 1st tee (arrowed on the photocopy below) but I regret to say that there is no clubhouse at all. The course is primarily for guests staying at the Jack Tar Village and they change in their guest-rooms. After their game they return to the village for showers, drinks. Local people may pay green - fees and play the course, but there are no changing facilities or showers/toilets for them. After their games they normally retire to the Monkey Bar at Frigate Bay Beach $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles away!

Congratulations on the Bronze Award for Tee Time.

GOLF SLOGAN POSTMARKS of the UNITED KINGDOM Part 3

The second publicity slogan cancellation for the ALCAN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS at the OLD COURSE, ST.ANDREWS appeared on August 2, 1967 and had a period of use up until October 8. The only exception to this was the slogan used at ARBROATH which terminated on September 30. Other than that this slogan was a clear-cut case of four slogans used at the four towns and all in the same position (Transposed).

To give it its full name - The ALCAN GOLFER of the YEAR CHAMPIONSHIP was won by Gay Brewer with a four round total score of 281.

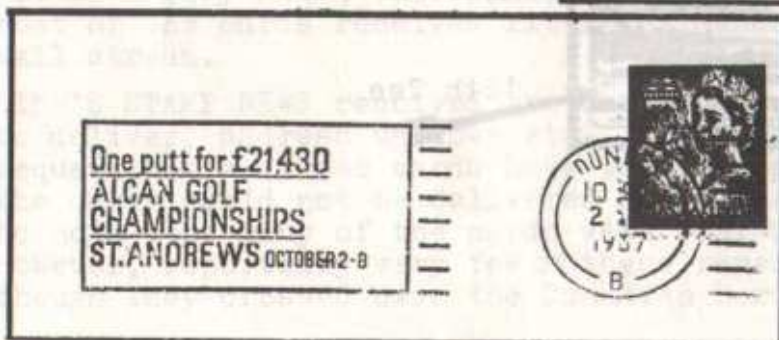

In 1968, the ALCAN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP moved to The ROYAL BIRKDALE Golf Course. A slogan cancellation was prepared and appeared on August 19, and was in use up until September 28. Used mainly at the Birmingham Office (3) with a fourth at Southport on September 17 thru October 2. (which was the first day of the Championship!) The three dies used at Birmingham are noted by the use of a 'Code Letter' at the foot of the Town Die and are described below. This was the last time the Champion-ship was played in the United Kingdom other than at Portland, Oregon in 1969 and at Portmarnock 1970. The Championship was discontinued, but had a nice ending when the Irish Post Office prepared a 'Skeleton' type datestamp for the Championship.

Note: Gay Brewer retained the Championship at Royal Birkdale.

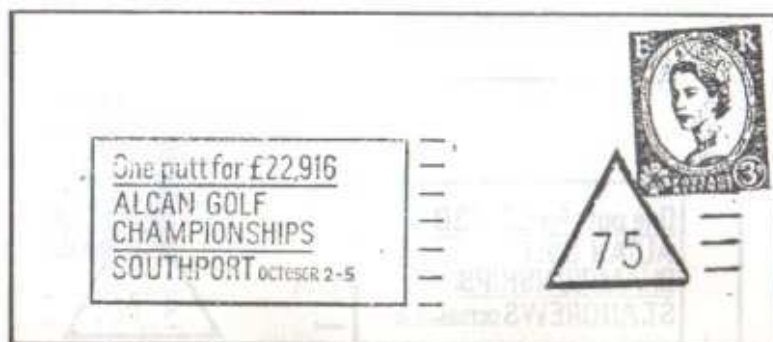

1. All lots are sold to the highest bidder at one bidding interval over the second highest bid. Bidding will be in \$0.50 intervals. On identical bids, the earlier postmark will govern. If only one bid is received on a lot, then the lot is sold at that bid.
2. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot prior to the sale. IPGS reserves the right to reject any bid believed not to have been made in good faith. Any bid not commensurate with the value of the offering may be rejected.
3. Terms of sale are cash and successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are sent.
4. NO BUYERS PREMIUM WILL BE ADDED TO THE SALES PRICE. No charges will be made to the executing bids. IPGS is not responsible for bidders errors or omissions.
5. Postage and handling charges are payable by the purchaser. A minimum charge of \$0.50 will be made for postage, insurance and handling, according to destination. Proof of sending to the advised address shall constitute delivery.

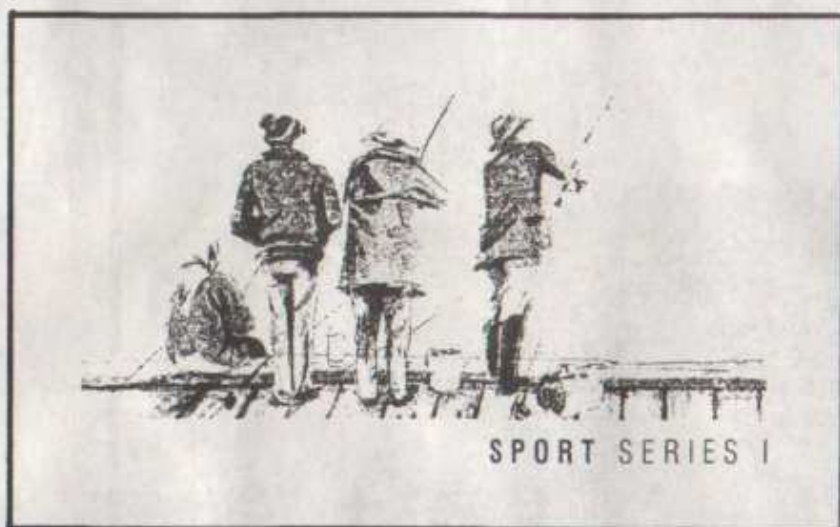

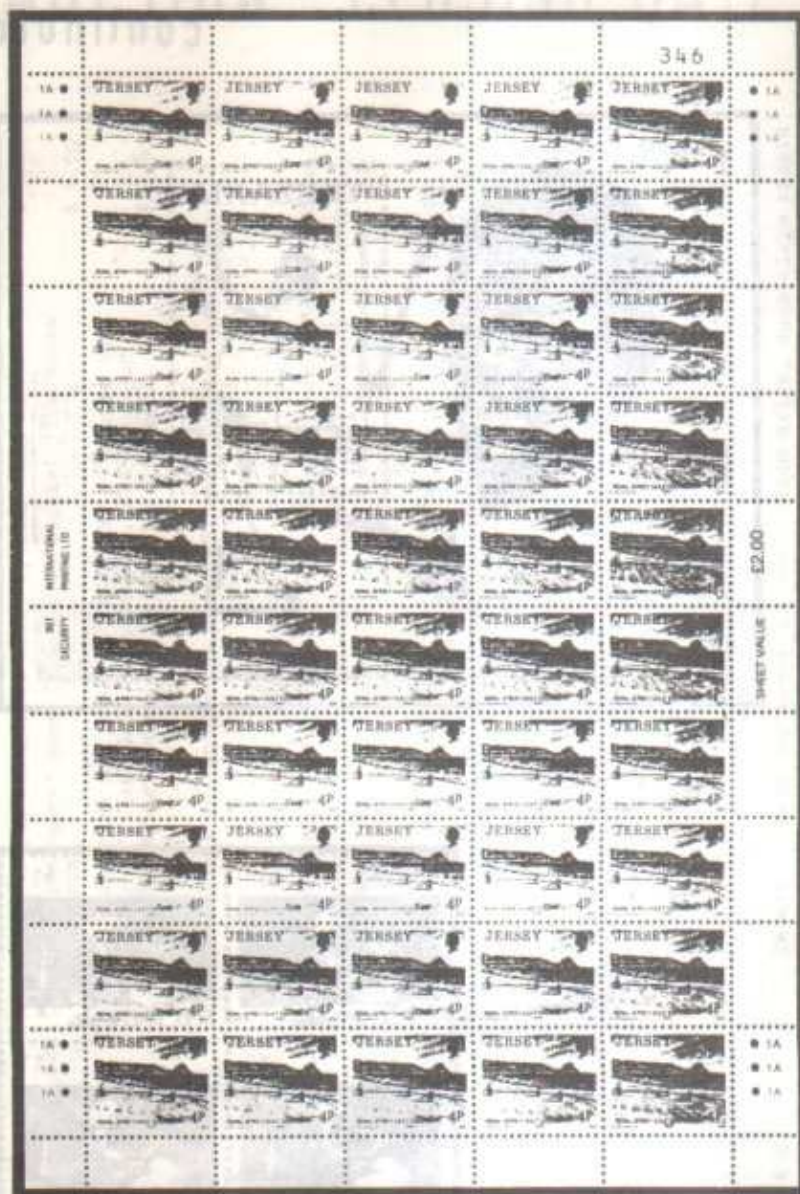
