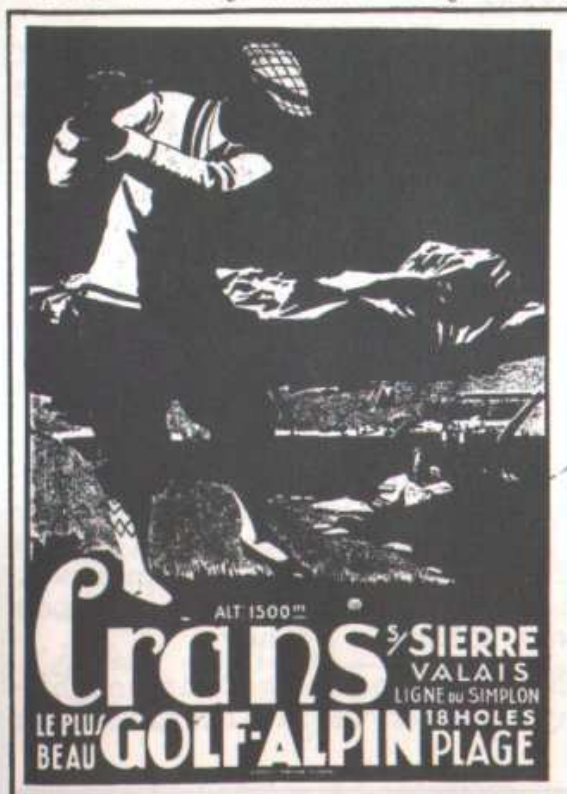

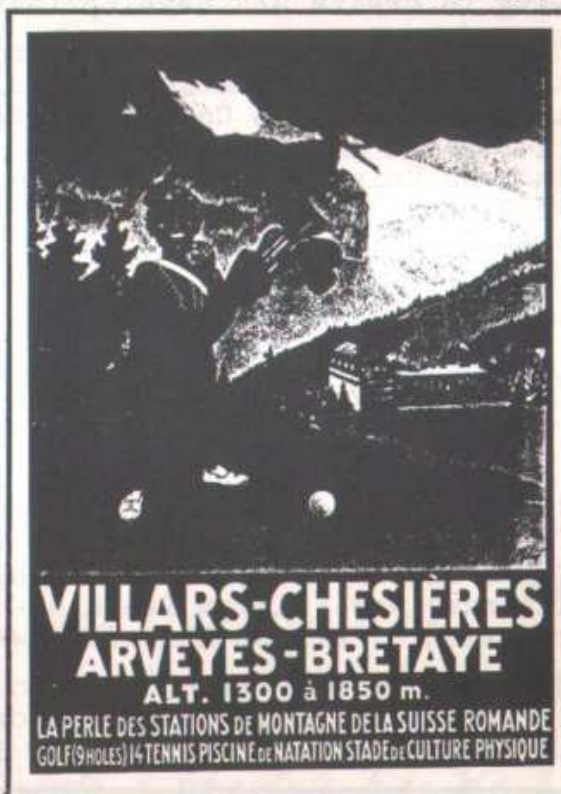

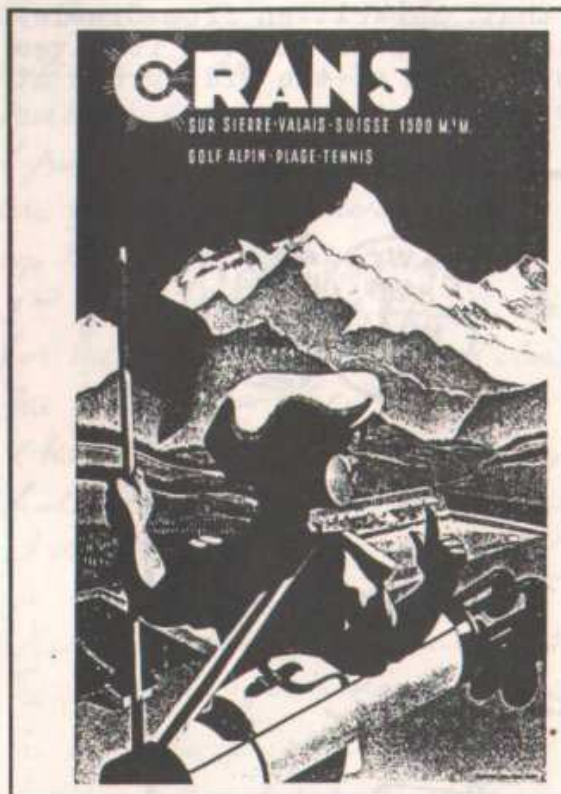

JAMES WILSON

James Wilson was one of the 9 signatories to the Declaration of Independence who could claim to be Scottish. His claims to fame rest on solid foundation and he is rightly honoured not only in the United States but throughout the world for his work in helping to create and develop that nation.

However it is his admittedly rather tenuous connection with golf that I wish to emphasise. His claim to be Scottish was impeccable as he was born at Carskerdo, near St. Andrews, on 14 September 1742 where his father, William Wilson, farmed. He entered St. Andrews University in 1757 when he was 15 years old and it would be a poor student indeed who did not try his hand at the local craze.

It should be remembered that the Society of St. Andrews Golfers - later to become the Royal and Ancient - had only been formed in 1754. As well as copying the rules of the Company of Gentlemen who played at Leith they promoted a competition among themselves for a silver club, as those players at Leith did. The St. Andrews club however was not obtained by gift of the Local Council but subscribed for by the members. Until 1824 the winner of the Silver Club Competition became Captain for the ensuing year. The very first winner (and therefore the first recorded Captain of the Royal and Ancient) was a Merchant in and Baillie of St. Andrews. His name was William Landale - and it is thought he was a close relation of Alison Landale - who was Wilson's mother.

More evidence of the connection between Wilson and golf is sought - in particular, did he ever show any signs of the affliction when in America?

A LETTER FROM LAURA 1898

Now and again one finds a letter with interesting golf contents and the letter shown here is just that. Written from Crawley (not Leonard) in 1898 from Laura to her sister Mary. It gives an account of her game and reconstruction of the 3rd. green at Ashdown. (note written on the 'Sabbath')



Dear Mary.

I had rather a nice game with the duck yesterday. I didn't play particularly well but my companion's score was $47 - 6 = 41$ which up to the time of my coming away was the best in. I expect some of the afternoon players will "pip" me. I know you like that expression. I skipped Miss Andrews by $\frac{1}{2}$ she being $41\frac{1}{2}$ net. There was

a ^{6?} sweep on the whole some but the best in was Miss Andrews 83 net, then me with 84 net. I should like to win for once very much. I did 46 in the afternoon of course. The boys are spending the morning cutting down the old tree by the globe artichokes. This afternoon a 4-some is planned whether I know not. I hear there is to be a cotillon on the 23rd. - And I believe by W. Watson. Rather a pity to spoil a nice dance

in my opinion. I believe Willie & I are going to give Peter a knife & Harry is going to give a Cyclometer. What are you? They are taking up the turf & levelling the 3rd green at Ashdown so for the present instead of doing the old long hole we play to the 7th green. It is a short hole but really tricky & I didn't succeed in doing it in less than 5 yesterday. Harry didn't get down till the 4 train yesterday. He says he has been frightfully busy this week so it is a good thing

he was stopping in town. He seems very cheerful. All the boys were pleased because I said I would play golf with them this afternoon. Father & Mother both caught a good deal. Mother seems better than Father I don't think is. His cough sounds entirely throat & I think he is going to try his tonic for a bit instead of the cough stuff, at my suggestion. My best love by aw all.

THE SOUTH AFRICAN 3 SHILLING BOOKLET

In 1948, South Africa issued a booklet which consisted of 6 panes: two panes Scott No. 46c penny Springbok, two panes pf No. 49d the 1 penny Jan van Riebeeck's Ship, two panes of No. 52d the 1½ penny stamp picturing a gold mine. A total of 36 pence in stamps (3 shillings)

This booklet features various advertising on interleaves: Seeds, Sports wear, Lighter, Writing Pad, Tea, Tires, Cigarettes, Fences etc. The one of interest to us is, however, an advertising feature of a Golfer in a swing position. In addition to these private ads, there are a few Post Office ads. There is also a pane of blue airmail labels in the middle of the booklet.

I recently had the opportunity to acquire a small accumulation of these booklets. Upon examining them, I noticed that all were different. The difference did not come from the advertising on the covers or interleaves. All were the same. They all feature the "Kirchhoffs for Seed" ad on the front cover (Illustration No. 1) and the same advertisings on the interleaves.

The difference comes from the postal advertising that are to be found on the margins of the booklet panes. All six are different: four of them are bilingual while one is solely in Afrikaans and another is solely in English. They are as follows:

ADDRESS LETTERS FULLY/ADRESSER BRIEWE VOLLEDIG (Illustration No. 2)

PACK PARCELS PROPERLY/VERPAK PAKKIES BEHOORLIK (Illustration No. 3)

REGISTER VALUABLE LETTERS/REGISTEER WAARDEVOLLEBRIEWE

(Illustration No. 4)

POST EARLY FOR QUICK DELIVERY/VROEG GEPOS BETEKEN VROEG AFGELEWER

(Illustration No. 5)

LUGPOS DIE SNELSTE POS (In Afrikaans)

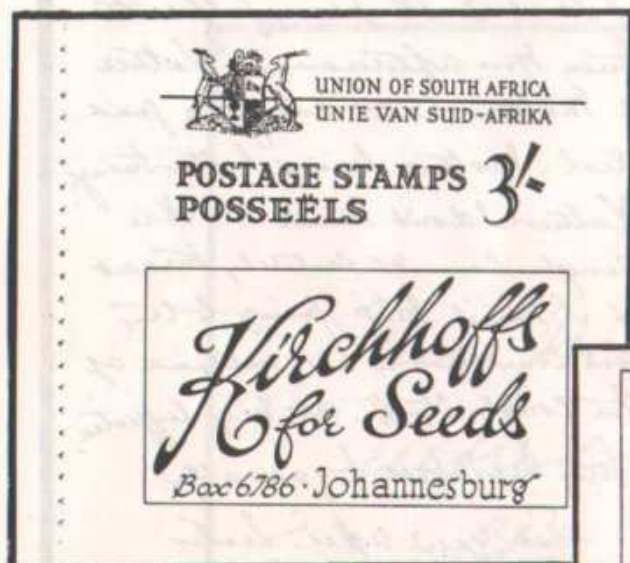

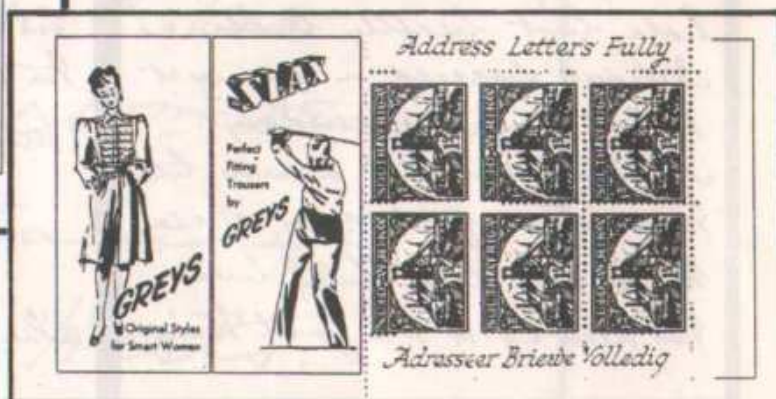
All the booklets are fairly difficult to find, however, I do not know if any version is scarcer than the other. Also I do not know of other versions of this booklet exist.

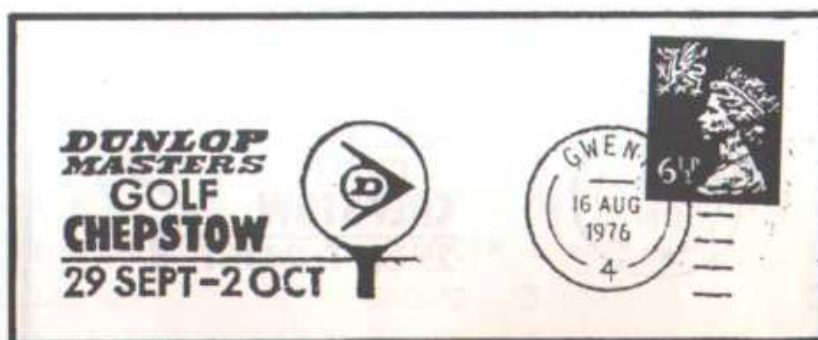

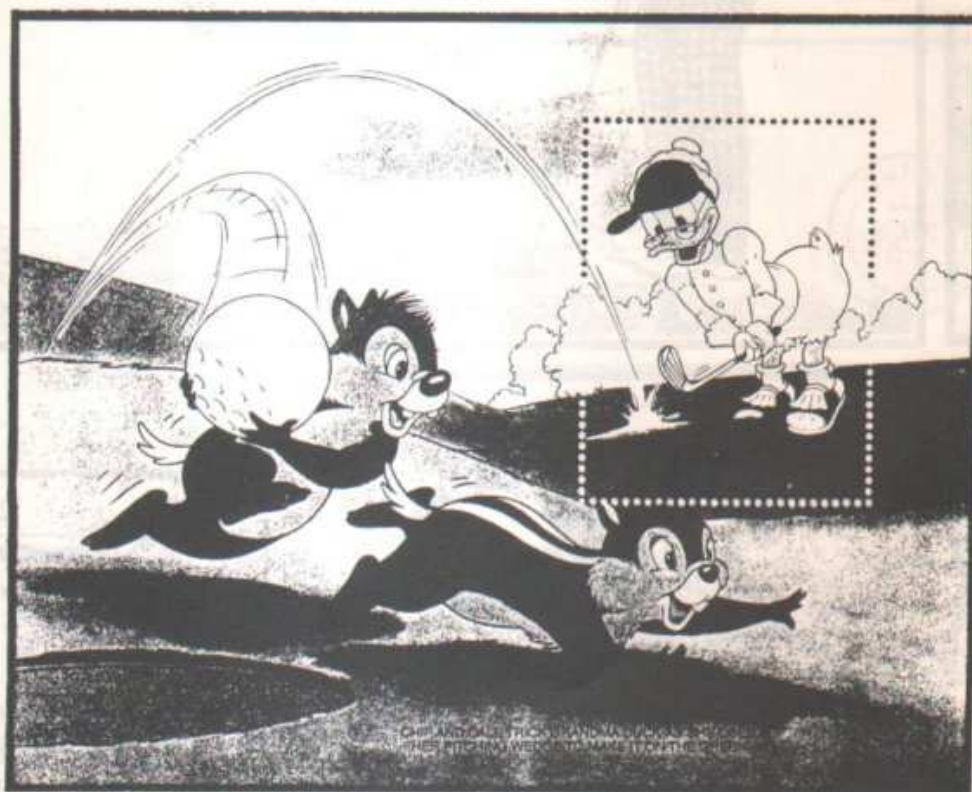
