SVEN TUMBA

What has this ice-hockey stamp to do with Golf? In fact it shows "Mr Golf" of Sweden, Sven Tumba.

This man started his remarkable sport career as an ice-hockey player. He bacame World Champion three times and is regarded as one of the best ice-hockey player in Europe ever. He was also an excellent Soccer player and played five times for the Swedish National Team.

After this career he started with golf at the age of about thirty, and with his great sport gifts he soon became a scratch player. In 1970 he became Scandinavian Champion, and he played for Sweden in the World Cup in Caracas 1974.

Sven Tumba already was a sports celebrity as an ice-hockey player, and now he made a huge PR-contribution among commom people for the game of golf. The number of golf players increased rapidly in Sweden during the Seventies thanks to him.

Over the past years he has worked with golf courses and tournaments, and is founder of the Scandinavian Open (now Swedish Masters). His latest project at the "age of 61" is a golf course in Moscow.

This stamp was issued for the - Ice Hockey World Championships in Stockholm 1963, and a photo of Sven Tumba was used as a pattern.

LUNARDI VISITS St. ANDREWS

This elegant young Italian was what today would be described as a ladies man, a daredevil, even perhaps adventurer. He was the first man to make an unteathered aerial ascent in England by balloon on 15 September 1784, just 11 months after Pilatre de Roziers famous first flight in Paris. However, in Scotland he was led by James "Balloon" Tytler, who ascended freely if somewhat uncontrolled on 27 August 1784 in Edinburgh.

But it was Lunardi who had the style and passion to attract not only the fashionable ladies but the general public as well. Possibly his training and certainly his position as Personal Private Secretary to the Neapolitan Ambassador to the Court of St James helped greatly in his desire to become famous and wealthy quickly.

A year after his successful English flight, Lunardi arrived in Edinburgh and after some initial problems ascended on 5th October, 1785 from the grounds of Heriot's Hospital. This was an unqualified success and he eventually landed in Fife at Coaltown of Callinge, 1 mile from Ceres and 3.5 from Cupar. After being feted in the County Town he preceeded to St Andrews at the invitation of Mr Stuart Grace, Secretary of the Society of Gentleman Golfers who of course at that time were in the midst of their Autumn Meeting. Lunardi duly appeared on the first tee of the Old Course, attended by a very large crowd, and after taking 21(!) for the first hole retired from golf as far as we know, forever. The Golfers had not finished with him yet; after custom of the time there were toasts and speeches and he was made a member of the prestigious Club. I do not know of anyone else who becamea member with such ease! Soon he was made a Freeman of St. Andrews itself, and Honorary Member of a dozen local clubs. And then of course there were the ladies: a hundred of the local beauties had assembled in his private suite at the Town Hall where a Grand Ball had been arranged.

Not surprisingly Lunardi slept late the next morning and indeed spent the whole of the forencon in bed prior to having a conducted tour of the University, the Castle and the Cathedral.

Soon he returned to Edinburgh and yet more adulation and flights from various locations in Scotland. Fashion followed, as it had done in England a year previously, with Lunardi skirts, kerchiefs, garters, and bonnets, many decorated with balloon motifs. But golf was ephemeral. No balls, bags, clubs, or accessories have been discovered carrying the Lunardi logo!
