- 4. NO BUYERS PREMIUM WILL BE ADDED TO THE SALE PRICE. No charges will be made to the executing bids. IPGS is not responsible for bidders errors or omissions.
- 5. Postage and handling charges are payable by the purchaser. Postal charge will be the current Air Mail Small Packet Rate (Surface in the U.K.) according to destination. Proof of posting to the advised address shall constitute delivery.
- 6. Should a claim for error of description arise, such claim must be made within three days of receipt of the lot. Claims made after that time cannot be considered. Lots described as collections, mixtures or damaged, etc., are not returnable under any circumstance.

MUIRFIELD

the world famous championship course and home of the Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfers has surrounding it North Berwick Golf Club (West Links) one of the oldest and most distinguished in the country and one of the few true "links" courses; the shorter East Links course which was originally laid out as a nine-hole course in 1894 by James Braid and Ben Sayers; the three Gullane courses, between them catering for all tastes and standards; Luffness New, which has been used as the qualifying course for the Open, and the seaside courses. The contrast of an inland course is at Haddington and there is a nine-hole course in the picturesque village of Gifford.

POSTCARD CORNER

by Stuart R. MacKenzie

Tom Brown (1870-1910) born in Nottingham was one of the most popular and famous of the postcard illustrators, with close to 1400 postcards to his credit.

He left school at an early age (11 years) and spent the first two years ofhis working life as an errand boy, first at a Milliner's and then at a lace market. At fourteen he began his apprenticeship with a Lithographic Printer and after a time became a designer.

He was encouraged to send some of his work to a comic paper publisher and was paid thirty shillings - at that time equal to three months wages. After his apprenticeship finished he went to Art School at Nottingham, but, London beckoned and he spent several years making ends meet.

Luck fell his way when he was invited to design a front - page for a comic paper - creating Weary Willie and Tired Tim. This was an instant success when sales of the paper soared.

After this success he was introduced to the Langham Sketching Club, meeting place for Artists. Work followed with some of work being being accepted by "Punch".

In 1898 he was made a member of the Royal Society of Britsih Artists and, in 1901, of the Royal Institute of Painters and Water Colour ists.

Postcard work flourished when he decided to see the World, visiting many countries including - China, Japan and The United States, where his work was published in the New York Times and Chicago Tribune.

On his return to the U.K., he set up a studio at Blackheath, London and continued to produce work that was published in The Illustrated Sports and Dramatic News, The London Magazine, Fry's Magazine, The Daily Chronicle and Weekly Telegraph.

In 1907 he was made President of the London Sketch Club.

Tragically, he died of Cancer in 1910 at the early age of 39

Quite a number of postcards were of golf humour. The following list gives details of the cards produced, mainly for Davidson Brothers.

ROYAL JERSEY GOLF CLUB CENTENARY ISSUE 1978 by Stuart R. MacKenzie

The Jersey Golf Club and 18 hole course was opened in 1877 and was able to add " Royal " to the title the following year (1878) when Queen Victoria's Warrant was received by the Lieutenant Governor.

The stamps are in the main a tribute to Harry Vardon who was Jersey birn (1870-1937) He won the "Open" Championship six times between 1896 and 1914 and still remains a record to this day. He also won the US Open in 1900.

A set of four stamps was issued on February 28, 1978, designed by Jennifer Toombs and printed in Lithography by Questa. Details are as follows:

COMB PERFORATION 143

6p turquoise-green, blue-green drab, gold and black

8p carmine-rose, lake-brown, black and gold

11p bright yellow-green, deep green, black and gold

13p mauve, reddish-vicet, black and gold

PLATE NUMBERS (Blocks of four) bottom margin below vertical Row 1 same order as Traffic Lights

11p 1A (x4) 1B (x4)
13p 1A (x4) 1B (x4) 2A-1A-1A-1A 2B-1B-1B-1B

MARGINAL inscription - " ROYAL JERSEY GOLF CLU CENTENARY " above vertucal Rows 274 - 8p. 11p. and 13p. The 6p. is not inscribed.

TRAFFIC LIGHTS: in form of Questa logo opposite Rows 1 and 10 at both sides. Colors are those shown for the stamp values.

SHEET VALUE: in top margin above Row 1/1.

SHEET SIZE: 50 (5 x 10)

QUANTITIES SOLD: 6p. 837,427; 8p. 851,904; 11p. 466,343; 13p. -368,648.
