The I.P.G.S. get together at World Columbian brought eight members together for an informal meeting on Sunday, May 24. Those present included Ross Candlish, Cora Collins, Janice and Walter Gindl, Ron Spiers, Larry Kobalt, Lois Nelson and Bill Wollney. The Gindl's brought along an album to show how they collected and I had photocopies of my exhibit for anyone interested. In addition, I.P.G.S. had a one frame exhibit in the club exhibition area. These exhibits are intended to present the society and hopefully interest some new people. Publicity on the society was also available at the American Topical Association table.

The next large exhibition in the US occurs in 1997 in San Francisco. Let's plan now to have a social hour during this event. If anyone in the San Francisco area would be willing to help with this event - please let me know.

World Columbian was really a great show for me. I found a great deal of material which I wanted and what I bought was reasonably priced. Needless to say there was a lot of other material there that was - much higher. Material even doubled in price right on the show floor when it was from one dealer's booth to another. In recent years I have learned that if you don't have to have it today, chances are good that you will find it later at a more reasonable price.

I want to take this opportunity to say thank you to our first Auctioneer, Clyde Stoddart. He came through and volunteered to take the Auction when we were first getting organized. From what I could tell, individuals found material that they wanted and the society made a profit which has now been deposited in our treasury.

Secondly, three sources have and are providing information on our society to assist us in recruiting new members. A topical dealer which has been most helpful is the Westminster Stamp Gallery, Ltd., P.O. Box 456, Foxboro, MA 02035. Each time an individual writes or orders golf related stamps, they send out a copy of our application form. Over the past several years, several new members have been recruited by our friends at Westminster - so we say thank you.

Another thank you to the American Topical Association. When new members of the ATA indicates that they collect golf material, they receive one of our applications. Applications are also made available at the ATA table at major US shows. And thirdly, a new book entitled "GOLF ANTIQUES AND OTHER TREASURES OF THE GOLF GAME", by John and Morton Olsen lists the IPGS in two different places with an address. We have already received several enquiries as a result of this book. This book is available from the Old Golf Shop, Ltd., 325 West Fifth Street, Cincinnati, OH 45202.

I would be remiss if I did not take this opportunity to announce that Eiron Morgan of Wales has agreed to become Auctioneer, and we thank him for volunteering. In regard to the auction, you may want to be cautious about sending cash through the mail. If the Auctioneer does not receive it, you will be out of money. Also you may want to pay extra and have any purchases insured, otherwise once again the bidder will be without. I personally have found postal money orders a good way to send money to other countries.

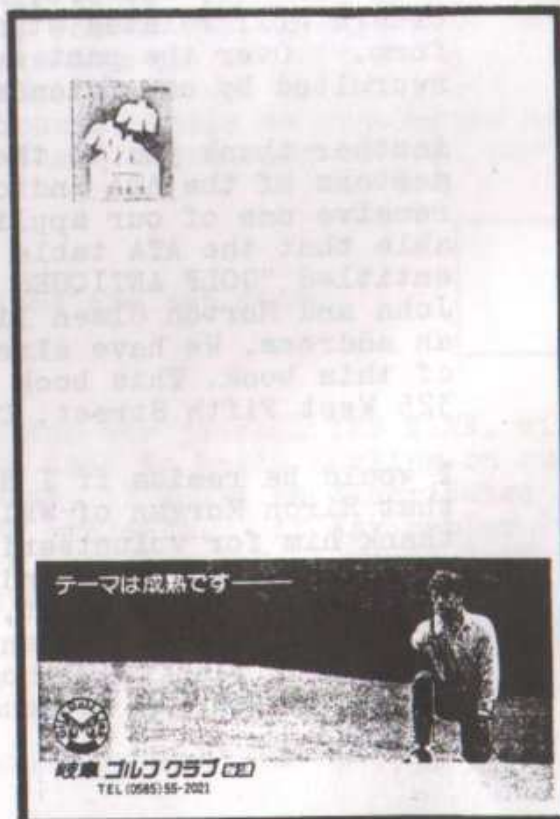

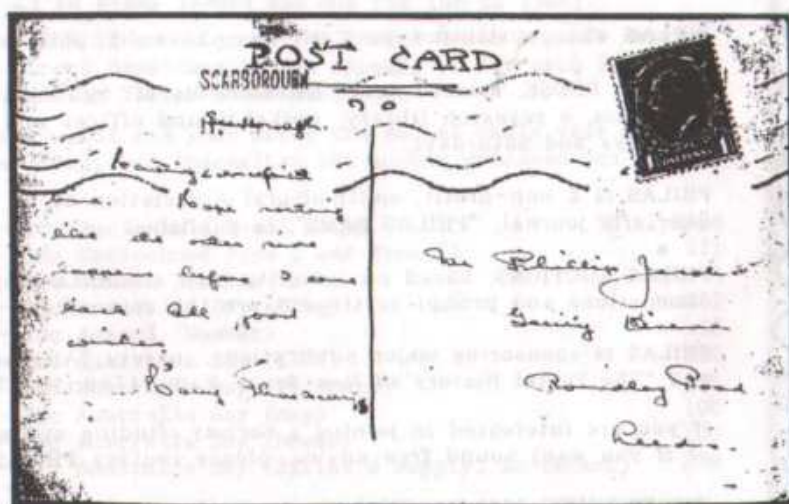

In 1978 a special commemorative post mark was produced for the opening of Philas House, N.S.W.

The design was the facade of the new building at 17 Brisbane Street and a panel on the gable. The motif used for this panel is the 'Golfer' from the 1974 Non Olympic Sports issue.

The special postmark used on Opening Day was struck in red (19 July 1978) The other days in black.

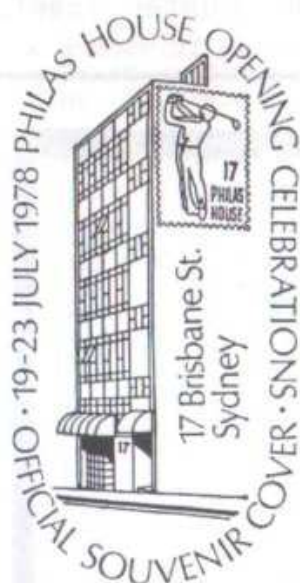

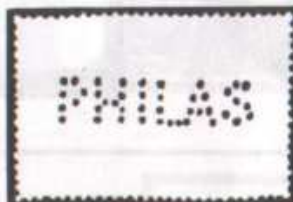

PHILAS PERFINS

Page from the PHILAS NEWS (Dec 1989) with information on these Philas Perrins (1975-83)

Item e) being the 20c 'Wombat' Perfin chosen for the special cover shown above.



PHILAS Perfins were devised in 1975 to aid in raising funds for the "Philas House Appeal". In that year and subsequent years, one stamp issue was selected and perforated with the word "PHILAS" under special licence from Australia Post.

This is the only known private philatelic perfin in Australia. Only one die has been used, applied to 10 stamp issues and one PSE (up to 1988).

Perfins were issued for each \$5 donation to the Philas House appeal. Perfins were issued for either direct donations to the appeal, or for each \$25 commission on material sold in Philas House Auctions.

Issues were not withdrawn until one year after the end of their year of issue. The first issue totalled 1460, but thereafter the number produced was usually between 100 and 200.

The perfins were only available cancelled on specially printed PHILAS HOUSE envelopes which were numbered up to the 1978 issue, and thereafter cancelled on normal PHILAS envelopes.

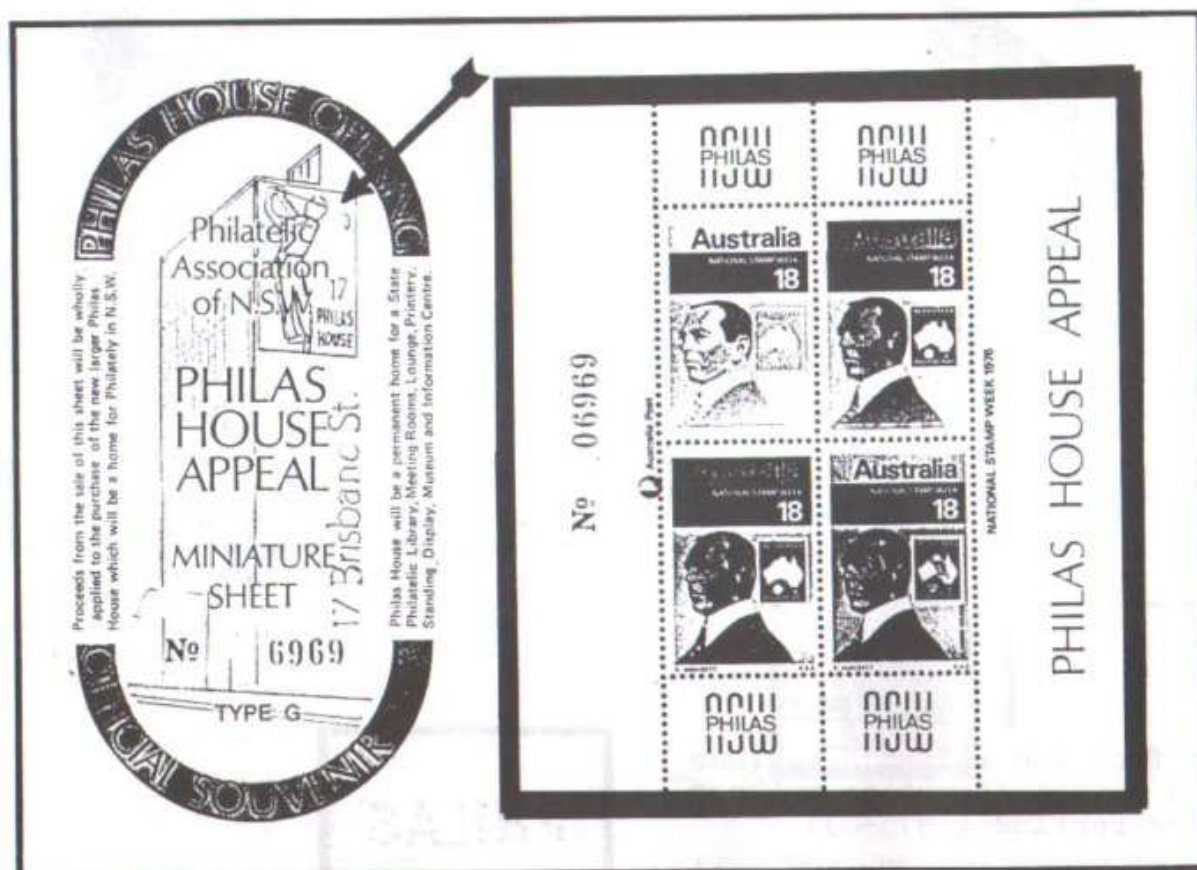
Item (e) 20c Wombat was available with red special Philas House postmark of 19.7.78, for the opening of PHILAS HOUSE.

The 1983 perfin was the last regular issue produced by Philas.

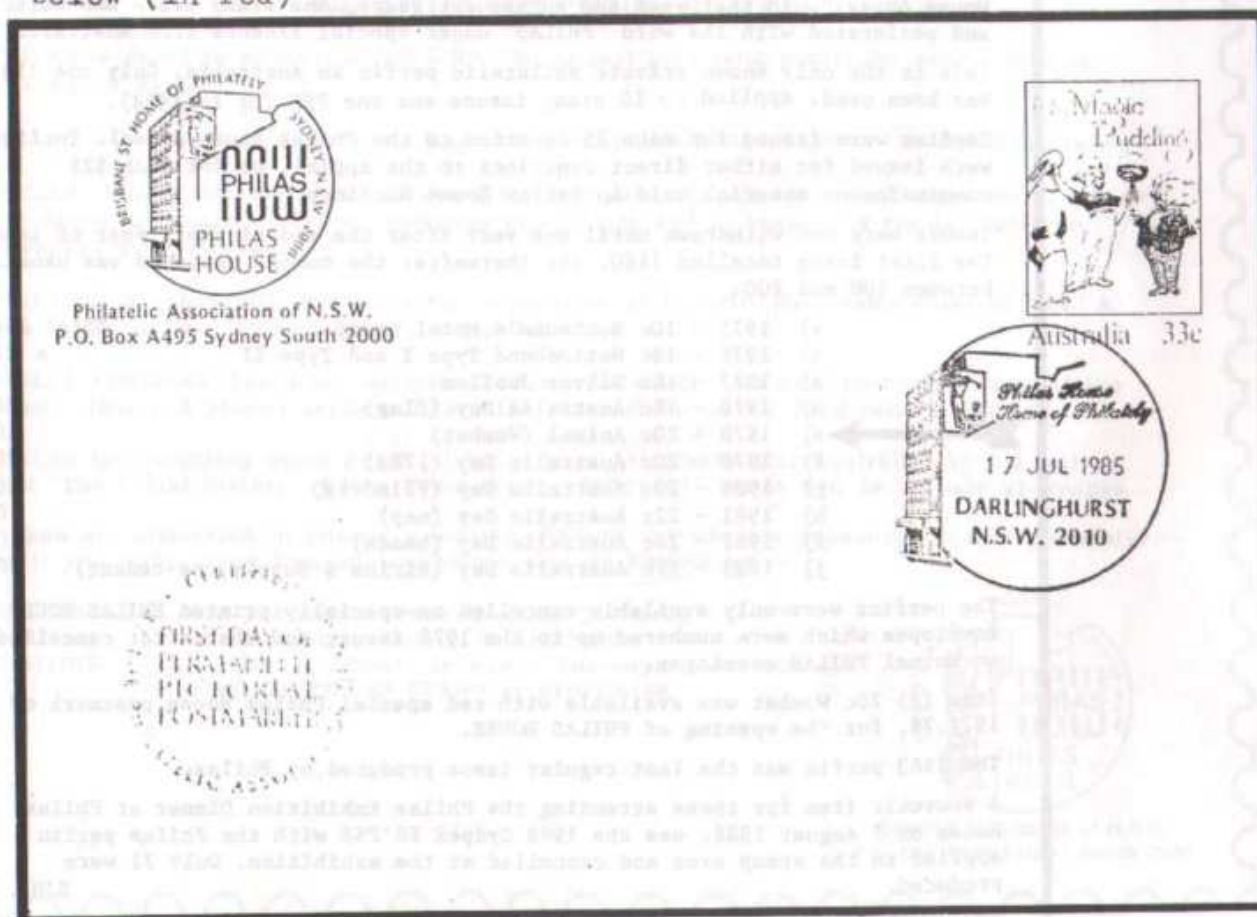
A souvenir item for those attending the Philas Exhibition Dinner at Philas House on 5 August 1988, was the 1988 Sydperx 88 PSE with the Philas perfin applied to the stamp area and cancelled at the exhibition. Only 71 were produced.

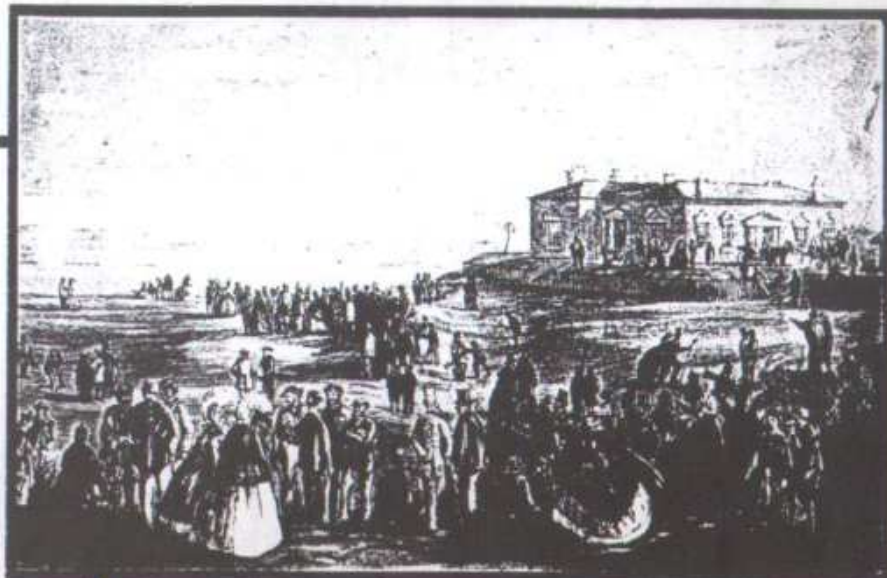

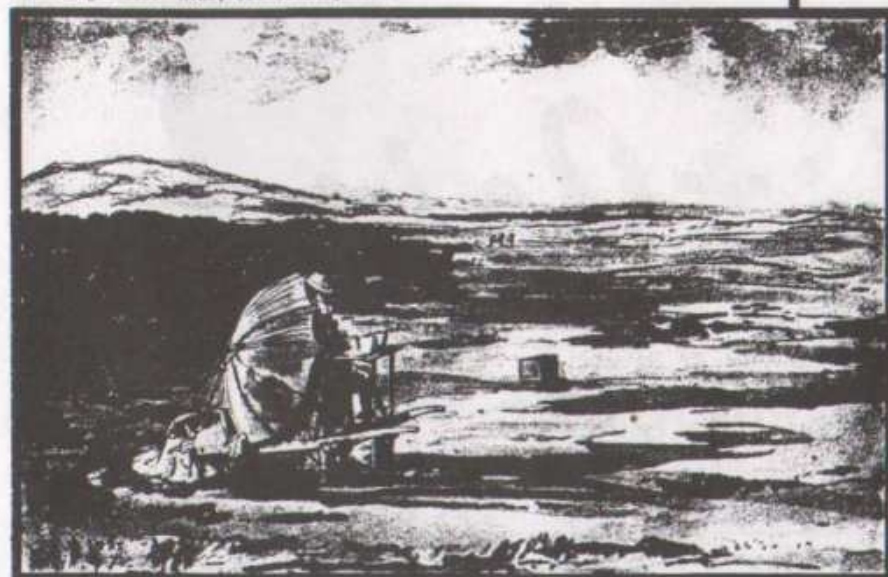
