



POSTCARD CORNER

In 1905 the Open was held at St Andrews and the Championship Trophy claimed for the second time by James Braid. It was also Old Tom's last stint as Starter and one wonders if he is occupying the box in this picture. Although this card is a reproduction of a 1905 original and does not state that it was taken during the Open I have some evidence that it was. The young man arrowed (aged about 20) is James Justice Christie, scion of an East Neuk family, whose son Gordon is still resident in St Andrews. Gordon (who is my uncle) maintains that his father told him this photo was taken at the time of the Open. The Christies were not a known golfing family but James' brother Andrew emigrated to the United States as a professional and is known to have given Walter Hagen his first golf lesson. J J Christie was an interesting man who became for many years St Andrews Firemaster - as a part-time occupation. He was also a very early user of the motor car in St Andrews bringing the petrol in cans from Leuchars Junction to where it had been sent by rail from the refinery in 'the South'. For the bicycle buffs the racing model shown is a 'back pedaller' with no front brakes and no mudguards.

Dear Mr. MacKenzie,


An interesting item in the september 1992 issue of "Tee Time" was the Philas House Opening.
Mr. Wilson Ilbery, Willoughby, Australia wrote me why the golfing stamp was used.

The building was bought jointly by the Golfing Association and the Philatelic Association. It was subsequently strata-titled with the Golf Association of N.S.W. owning the top 2 floors, the Ladies Golf Union owning the middle floor, and the Philatelic Association of N.S.W. owning the bottom 2 floors. The building could not be called "Golf House" because that was the name of a commercial building 2 blocks away. As an architect for the renovations Mr. Ilbery suggested the golf stamp logo. He also did the artwork for the opening postmark, cover and catalogue, but the permanent postmark was modified by P.O. artists.



ST. ANDREWS OCTOBER MEET 1862

It is always nice to 'personalise' the postcards in our collections in some way - recognise the people shown or post them on the spot oneself perhaps? The illustrations in TT 21 of the 'Hodge' cards produced on behalf of the R & A in 1986 reminded me of a couple in my possession. The first of these is that showing the 4th or Ginger Beer hole so called because of the refreshments available there courtesy of 'Old Daw' (David Anderson, father of Jamie - 3 times winner of the Open) who is shown in the sketch. Old Daw is an ancestor of mine and there is a delightful family story that the privileged, including the Sheriff, could be assured of a warming cinder in their lemonade during the cold months - for the proper reimbursement of course!

The other card of this set I posted myself on the first day of the 1987 Dunhill Cup. The card is the one showing the R & A October Meet in 1862 - 125 years exactly before the posting date of 1 October. Some fast talking ensured the application of the St Andrews single ring cancel on the front, thus ensuring a Dunhill souvenir in the maxicard category!



FRENCH GOLF SLOGANS ON 'DAGUIN' POST MARKS

Georges JEANNEAU.

In 1882, Eugene DAGUIN, French engineer registered a patent for a mechanical machine intended for stamps cancellations.

Putting into service in 1884 this machine worked untill 1967 in several hundreds French Post offices, on account of its robustness, its small cost, its easiness using.

Advertising texts appeared arround 1920, and slugans praised tourist-places: Riviera, spas, Basque-coast...

During 1985, French Post Service commemorated the "DAGUIN MACHINE" centenary and issued one stamp showing this one, and its characteristic mark.





After long study and research about this subject, I Think that only seven towns promoted GOLF with "DAGUIN POST-MARKS".
