JAPANESE ECHO CARDS

Yutaka Matsubayashi and Cora Collins

Prior issues of golf related echo cards have appeared in *Tee Time* numbers 6,7,16,17 and 21. This is a continuation of the cards through calendar year 1994. As you will note, the first two cards were missed during earlier listings. Rather than renumber all the cards after number 36, additional alpha has been assigned to the two missed cards. For example, 36A was the issue following number 36. Likewise 46A was the issue following number 46.

In 1981 when echo cards were introduced by the Japanese postal administration, the second class postage rate for postcards (government or private) was 40 yen. In 1989 a tax was added bringing the postcard rate to 41 yen. Finally, in 1994 a postal increase resulted in a 50 yen rate. These advertising cards have always been sold "below face" because the advertiser pays a portion of the fee - normally 5 yen. (See *Tee Time* No. 6, pgs. 64-65 for details).

Three new stamp designs or indicia were added in 1991 to mark the 10th anniversary of Echo postal cards. We are identifying these three stamp designs as "D", "E" and "F". The designs are shown below (enlarged to 125%). For illustrations and details on the first three stamp designs, see *Tee Time* No. 6, pg. 65.



A new category of echo cards was created in 1992, recycled - paper echo postcards with surtax. These issues are equivalent to semi - postal issues with a portion of the cost donated for a specific purpose - "recycled used for environmental preservation". In 1992 the imprinted stamps or indicia on these cards was "41 + 1" but were sold at 40 yen. Another inscription says 36 yen price and 4 yen donation. The recycled cards are currently 50 + 3. We have chosen to list these cards seperately and the numbers will begin with SP1, SP2, etc. Golf related recycled cards will be featured in the December 1995 issue of *Tee Time*.

We have elected to show only the advertising portion of the echo cards to conserve some space, however we have included the stamp design list (the only variable design) for your convenience. Showing only the bottom portion of the cards is the means by which the cards have been depicted in Japanese catalogues. Hopefully at a future date we can make available a complete illustrated list of the cards for interested members.

Welcome to The Cancel Corner. It is our desire to keep all IPGS members informed of specific cancels related to golf from the United States Postal Service. If you do not collect in this area, perhaps you will develop an interest.

Usually, the USPS will authorize special cancels for six to eight golf events per year. Over the past five years, Tee Time's intent has been to list and illustrate those golf related cancels from the USPS. In a future column, a more extensive list will be published to catalogue cancels used prior to 1995.

Cancels come in many shapes and sizes. There have been two different size cancels used for the same event, and the same cancel used with two different colors of ink. Usually, the cancels will show a golf tournament, but there have been other themes as well.

Hopefully, this list is complete for 1995. If any members know of any other golf cancels used for 1995 which have not been listed, please write to the editor of Tee Time.

ALAND ISLANDS According to The Stanley Gibbons Catalogue, Aland is an autonomous Province of Finland. Finnish stamps were used on Aland until 1984.

On May 12, 1995, a set of two stamps were issued, one of them on golf, a lady swinging a club (Fig. 1). Also, the postal administration issued a FDC (Fig. 2). The cancellation is a golf ball inside two concentric rings. The legend in the crown of these circles reads "o MARIEHAMN 12.5.1995 o FORSTDAGEN". (Fig. 2A)

BATUM According to The Scott Catalogue, Batum, located in the Black Sea, is the Capitol of Adzhar, a territory that in 1921 became an autonomous republic of the Georgian Soviet Socialist Republic.

The exact date of issue of the Sports set involving six different sports presented in two sheetlets of four and two, is unclear at this time. The stamps show Soccer, Cricket, American Football and Golf in the sheetlet of four stamps. (Fig. 3) This sheetlet of four stamps can be found perforated and imperforated. Rugby and Baseball are shown on the sheetlet of two stamps.

At the same time a new sheetlet came to light showing only the Golf player (also perf. and imperf.) This new sheetlet (Fig. 4) has drawings on the selvage (painted in light blue) of what, in my estimation, looks like a baseball bat, cricket paddle, golf club, fishing hook, badminton racquet and shuttle, tennis racquet and skis.

Three different FDC's, with three different dates have been discovered. Unfortunately, the exact date of issue has not been confirmed.

Upon finding the real first day of issue, you will be updated in a future column. Needless to say, the cooperation of our members will be appreciated in solving this mystery.

GUERNSEY It has just been announced that the issuance of the air gram from The Guernsey Islands has been postponed until September. Hopefully, an update will be in the next Tee Time.

CANADA On June 6, 1995, Canada issued a set of five golf stamps to commemorate the 100th anniversary of The Royal Canadian Golf Association. (Fig. 5)

The stamps, in booklet format, come in a pane formed by two rows of stamps, so that you will see two of each stamp in each pane. There is one pane per booklet. The inside cover of the booklet is extremely interesting as in just a couple of lines you become acquainted with five famous Canadian golfers, namely Stanley Thompson, George Knudson, Harvey Combe, Mabel Thomson and Alexander Dennison.
