




Word of Thanks

SPANISH GOLF CANCELLATIONS

Centenary of the Real Golf Club of Las Palmas (1891-1991)

The Real Golf Club of Las Palmas was founded in 1891. It was the first golf course built in Spain and is located about 15 kilometers from the city of Las Palmas, on the Isla de Gran Canaria (Grand Canary Island). The course is practically located inside the crater of an old volcano. As a result, the panoramic view of the island is exceptional.

The oldest course in Spain, designed by Scotsman, Ross Mackenzie, offers the golf enthusiast an entertaining run, the advantages of a marvelous climate and hotel only 10 meters from the tee of hole No. 1.





World Cup 1973

The 1973 World Cup of Golf was held on the Nueva Andalucia Golf Course, Marbella, Spain. The course which opened in 1968, was designed by the famous golf architect Robert Trent Jones.

The winning team was from the United States: Jack Nicholas and Johnny Miller, with a score of 558 The second place team was South Africa: Gary Player and Hugh Baiocchi.

Individual champion was: Johnny Miller with 277 strokes.



Knickers Missing on Canadian Stamp

Linn's Stamp News, July 3, 1995, is the basis for the following article. According to the article written by Michael Schreiber, of Linn's staff, one of the men pictured on Canada's recent 43c Victoria Golf Club stamp (Figure 1) is missing his knickers. The stamp was issued June 6, 1995 in a booklet format along with four other stamps featuring Canadian golf courses.

The design error was revealed at Pipex 95, a stamp show being held in Victoria, British Columbia.

General Manager of the Victoria Golf Club, Don Francis, noted that he and the club professional Mike Parker were wearing knickers when they were photographed for potential pictures to be used for the stamp design. In the stamp shown here, Francis is standing on the left of the green as Parker in the background has made his chip shot to the pin. Parker in the background is shown wearing knickers, but Francis has on straight-legged slacks.

Francis said that Canada Post probably thought that slacks looked better on the stamp and modified the photograph. With some amusement, Francis said that the designer, however, forgot to change Francis' shadow, which falls over the green just in front of Parker's ball. On the stamp, the narrow shape of Francis' legs below the knickers still is visible in the shadow on the green.

Francis spoke at a ceremony during Pipex 95. At the show, in a re-enactment of a ceremony held earlier that year, the postmaster of Saanichton, British Columbia, presented to Francis an enlarged model of the stamp design prepared by Canada Post. The framed model will be displayed at the Victoria Golf Club.

The 43c stamp also pictures golfer Harvey Combe in silhouette. Combe is reportedly the best golfer in Western Canada prior to World War I. A vignette of the Victoria Golf Club's clubhouse is inset below the scene of Francis and Parker.

Those who look closely at the design will see that the pin seems to cast no shadow. It is presumed that shadow was



removed so it would not clash with the inset.

The U.S. golf stamp, issued in May 1995, (Scott #2964) has been found with the yellow and gold colors missing. The golf stamp and the other sports on the strip of five different sports appeared in an auction which reported 8 known copies. This would indicate that two sheets have been discovered. However, there is the potential for a total of 24 since the sheets were printed in panes of six. Missing colors are classified as printing errors as opposed to an oddity or This kind of error is not freak. common, however it is not that unusual with modern day printing processes.

PERFINS ON COVER

The following cover (figure 1) appeared in the journal of the perfin society several years ago. A photocopy of the page was sent to me from an individual in California. When I received the photocopy, I went directly to a perfin collector in our local stamp club. I soon learned that he had already written to the owner of the cover to begin negotiations on securing the cover for me. He had material which the other collector wanted so they worked out a trade and then I bought the cover from the individual in my local club.

For those of you not familiar with the term perfinit stands for perforated initials/insignia. Perfins are stamps which have been perforated with designs, initials, or numerals by private firms and governmental agencies to discourage theft and misuse. The perforating of stamps as a security measure was first authorized in Great Britain in 1869. However, it wasn't until April 1908 that

the use of perfins was authorized in the United States.


Figure 2 (right)

While this cover is an advertising corner card it has the further advantage of having a perfin affixed for postage. The company advertised was a subsidiary of the B. F. Goodrich Tire and Rubber Co., Akron, Ohio. Coburn Haskell, a wealthy sportsman, combined forces with Bertram Work, an employee of the B.F. Goodrich company, to develop the rubber cored golf ball. Hence, we find usage of the perfin "BFG" (figure 2) of the parent company.

The early recipient of the cover was apparently a stamp collector or philatelist. The pencil notation on the cover comments on the early usage of a perfin, August 1908.

Perfins have been used in many other countries. The second cover (figure 3) has the perfin of the Dunlop Tire and Rubber Company, "DRC". I originally bought this cover because of the golf seal on the reverse side of the cover (figure 4). Several years later I discovered the perfin usage.




The October 10, 1996 cancellation was for the Betsy King Classic. 1996 was the first year for this tour event. It was held in the Pennsylvania town, Limekiln, where Betsy King resides.



The November 23 and 24, 1996 cancellation was for the 25th Anniversary of the Sports Hall of Fame located in Elyria, Ohio. The Hall of Fame opened in 1971 with numerous sports as well as area high schools being recognized.

On September 19th, 1996 Colombia issues a stamp (figure 1) honoring the 59th Anniversary of the Federation Colombiana De Golf. A brochure issued by the Colombian post office indicates the history of the Federation, plus the influence of golf players from Atgentina, Spain and the USA. It also mentions that Maria Isabel Baena from Colombia was the first one to classify in the US Ladies Open. Figure 2 illustrates the First Day Cover issued in Bogota for the stamp.

The philatelic press in the U.S. has had numerous articles about issues from the countries which were formerly part of the USSR. Articles have indicated that they are not valid for postage, but are produced outside the countries as money making schemes. If any collectors from other countries can shed any light on these issues, we would be most happy to hear from them.

Buryat, located in Southern Siberia, commemorated Thailand '96 with a souvenir sheet (figure 5) and it shows Tiger Woods in the upper left corner. Additionally, it issued a strip of three stamps showing Isso Aoki, Joe Ozaki and Ayako Okomoto (figure 6).




