CANCEL CORNER

A special word of thanks to William Graham, Bernard Bergeret and Eiron Morgan who also provided copies of a number of the cancellations featured below.

There are two new US cancels to report in this issue and one variety. We also have one correction from a cancellation reported in the December 1997 issue.

The following is a list of cancels that we have received as of February 8, 1998.

Huntington Breast Cancer Action Coalition Station, Northport, NewYork, October 27, 1997 one cancel in black.

World Cup Station, Kiawah Island, South Carolina, November 20, 1997. The United States hosted the World Cup of Golf at Kiawah Island, on the Ocean Course, November 20-23. However, the cancel was only available for the one day. Red ink was used on the covers submitted for cancellation, however black was used on the cover sold by the post office, see below. It also appears to be smaller. It can be ordered (at a cost of \$3.00) from the postmaster, World Cup of Golf, John's Island, SC 29455 USA.





As mentioned in the last issue of *TEE TIME*, we would investigate other dates used for the Betsy King Golf Classic cancel. According to the postmaster in Limekiln, Pennsylvania, the cancellation was used on only one date, October 2, 1997. He sent us an official cover showing a woman golfer swinging a golf club with a picture of a golf hole in the background. We do not have a price on this item, however you may contact the postmaster in Limekiln, PA 19535 for further information.



Two other cancellations, one from Montchanin, France and one from Douglas, Isle of Man have been provided. The cancellation from Montchanin was designed by one of our members, Bernard Bergeret. Eiron Morgan provided a copy of the Isle of Man cancellation.

Unfortunately, no other information was provided for these two cancellations. One might assume that each cancellation was available for one day. If anyone can provide additional information, we would welcome hearing from you.

We also received a photocopy of a slogan meter used to publicize the Sarazen World Open sponsored by Subaru. The Sarazen World Championship was held on the Legends Course, Chateau Elan, Braselton, Georgia, November 6-9, 1997. If anyone has a clear reproducible copy of this meter, we will be glad to feature it in a future edition of *TEE TIME*.





POSTAL STATIONERY

A number of postal stationery items have been uncovered in recent years which have never been illustrated in *TEE TIME*.

A golf course with a group of golfers is shown on Belgium view cards. These cards present a problem of identification as they were printed and revalued over a number of years with different borders and some exist with and without the descriptive text on the left. Eiron Morgan was the first one to identify this postal card.

The 35c green on cream card was issued in 1930 and was one of a set of 25 cards with different views. Later in 1930 this card was revalued to 40c with a 5c handstamp. The other two cards appear to be part of the 1931 issue, 40c brown on cream and a 1 Fr rose carmine on pale blue. Both of these cards were also issued in sets of 25 different views. However, note that the 1 Fr value has added text on the left side of the card describing the resort area of Den-Haan on the coast of Belgium. This would indicate that there were at least two printings of this issue as this same design and value exists without the text as well. Also, the French postage due stamp indicates the rate was underpaid when the card was sent from Brussells to Lyon, France.

If anyone can enlighten us on the various issues, we would appreciate having the information so that we can provide it to the membership.

Two additional Belgium advertising postal cards have also been identified. These are known as publibels. The first one advertises miniature golf at Le Wimbledon and was issued in 1966. The second advertises Han s/lesse sports, one of which is golf. This card was issued in 1970 and exists in both French and Dutch versions as well as a number of surcharges. Note each of the cards have a publibel number in the lower left corner. Many of these advertising cards were reissued with different values and when that happened the publibel number was changed. The second card is the French version, Carte Postale, publibel 2420 and the Dutch version, Briefkaart, is publibel 2421 (not shown).

It would be ideal to come up with a complete listing of the publibel numbers for each of the designs. If you can help in this, we would appreciate hearing from you.

A LITTLE POSTAL HISTORY

The following post card was recently found in an auction. Around the turn of the century, W. E. Bryan, then president of the Milwaukee railroad, often played golf at the Glen View Country Club. Mr. Bryan would stop the train at the nearest point between the railroad and the club in order to play a game of golf. Later, the Village of Golf grew up at this location. For a more complete history of Golf, Illinois, see *TEE TIME*, No. 3, March 1988, pages 27 to 29. A variety of cancellations from Golf are also depicted as a part of this article.



The card was originally sent from Cartagena, in Columbia, South America to the Glennview Country Club, Golf, Illinois. Since the addressee of the post card no longer lived in Golf, Illinois, the card was forwarded with the Golf cancellation, December 20, 1933, to Chicago. On December 21, 1933, it was redirected to Berkeley, California with the Chicago cancellation and an additional United States stamp applied over the original two Columbian stamps. Unfortunately, the original date of mailing was obscured with the application of the US stamp.

The picture side of the card shows a picture of the Hotel Del Prado Barranquilla. You will find both Cartagena and Barranquilla on the northern coast of Columbia located on the Caribbean Sea. From both the location and the picture, this was considered a resort area in Columbia.

Studying the postal history of items in our collection can be an interesting aspect of stamp collecting. If you have interesting items in your collection which might be featured, please send along a reproducible copy, along with your research on the material.

NEW ISSUES

Two additional souvenir sheets have been issued with Mildred Didrikson, more commonly known as Babe Zaharias. One of the souvenir sheets was isued by St. Vincent and the Grenadines and the second by Maldives. Both souvenir sheets feature her on the upper right stamp. While we do not yet have a date of ssue, we might surmise they were issued in 1996 for the summer Olympics since both issues feature her as an Olympian star of Track and Field.



Two new postal stationery items have been provided. One issue is an envelope from France. The envelope is prepaid (no value depicted on the indicia) for international usage. It was issued on June 30, 1997 as one of a set of five envelopes, each with a different design. The one shown is the same design as the 1962 stamp issue, Scott 1027. Each envelope includes a card with the same design in the upper corner for correspondence. Copies and information regarding this envelope were provided by Bernard Bergeret and Jean-Pierre Picquot.





Our second postal stationery item is a Portokort from Sweden. This was provided by Mats Hogberg. The cards are numbered and this one is PK 0452. The illustration on the card was designed by Goran Lindgren and it was issued in April 1997. A quantity of 1,000 cards were issued. These portokorts, a type of postal card, are issued for use in Sweden only. The indicia carries no numerical value.
