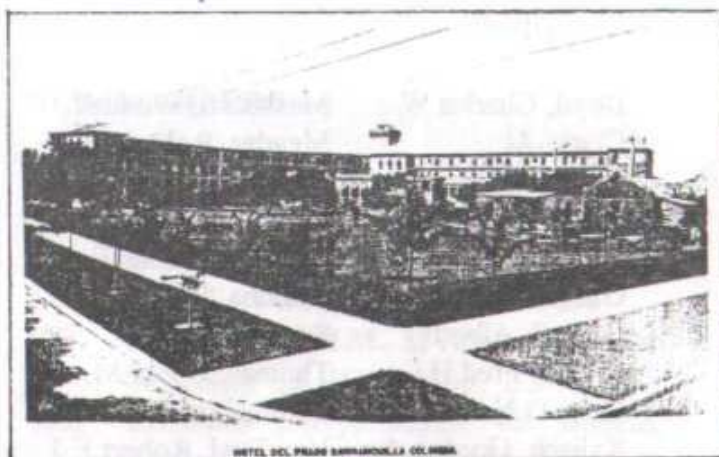

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

...A few comments on the article, page 9 (March 1998, Vol. Four, Issue 1) regarding the card from Cartagena, Colombia...The first time I stayed there (Hotel Del Prado in Barranquilla)...--1976 or 1977—it was like I had entered another century. It was in very good condition but no air conditioning, just big overhead fans in each room; no TVs; very attractive lobby area; high ceilings, people relaxing in a covered, outdoor lounge. I particularly remember the outdoor corridors that went to the rooms. There were lots of people to help with luggage or whatever else was needed. My other recollection of that initial visit is that you didn't have to go far from the hotel to get into some rather poor areas.



Now the Hotel Del Prado still looks the same but has a lot of added amenities such as air conditioning, swimming pool, TVs, and so on. Service is still good and the price is not too bad. While the overall quality of housing and infrastructure in Barranquilla has improved since my first visit, it is much more of an industrial town than a resort. The traffic jams there can be of truly historic proportions.

Cartagena, on the other hand, is definitely a resort. Located right on the Atlantic, it features many resort hotels, good beaches, an old Spanish fort and a restored historical area. There are a number of good restaurants and places to visit.

## GOLF PERMIT IMPRINTS

Even though permit imprint mail does not have an adhesive stamp on it, imprint mail can add variety to a philatelic golf collection as an example of contemporary postal history. Permit imprints are printed on to the envelope in the same location where a stamp would have been applied. Permits are not required to show a postal denomination. Their purpose is to indicate that the user is making a stampless mailing and has paid the post office in advance.

Businesses often prefer to use permit imprint mail because it is more economical. It saves a business time and money to have a large quantity of envelopes printed with identical imprints rather than to affix stamps to their large mailings. The information included in the imprint consists of the classification of the item, the phrase "US Postage Paid" and the name of the mailer. In place of the name of the mailer the mailer's permit number and post office location can be used if the mailer sends items out from only one post office.

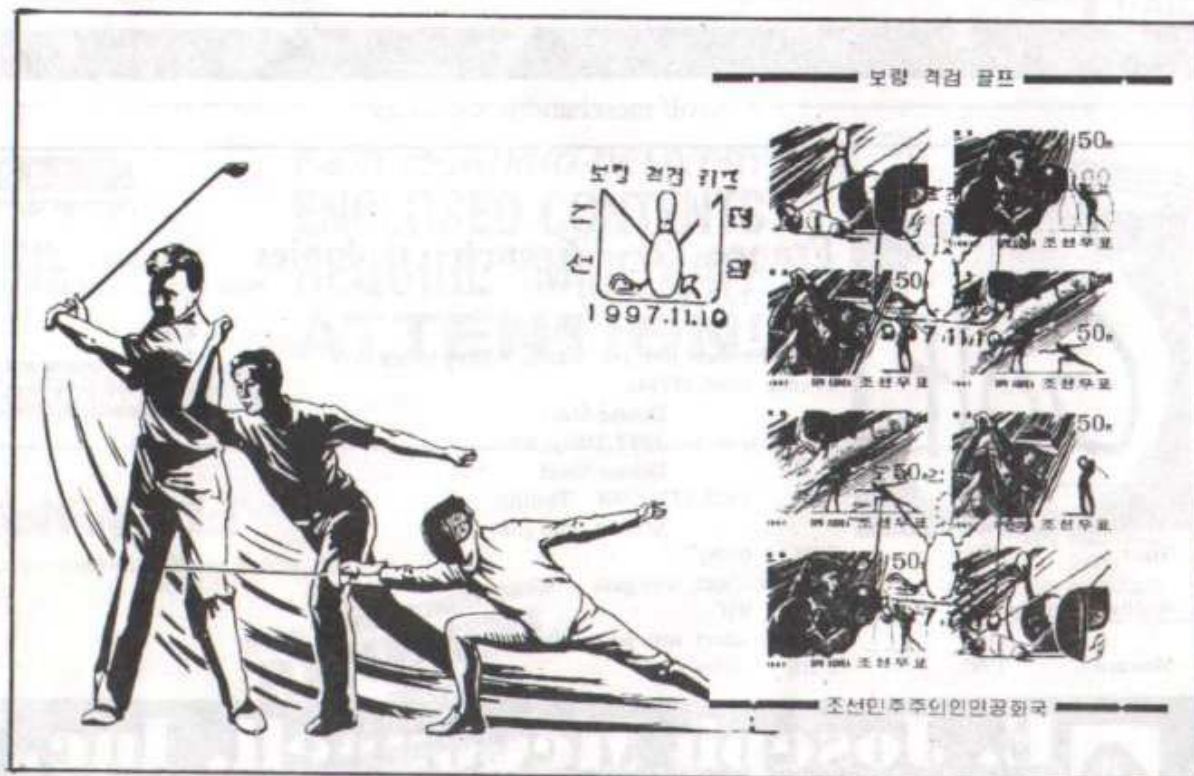
## NEW ISSUES

One correction to the column in the March issue (Vol. Four, Issue 1, March 1998) page 10. Mildred Didrikson or Babe Zaharias was identified as being on the upper right stamp of the St. Vincent and the Grenadines souvenir sheet. In fact, she appears on the stamp just below that one—throwing a javelin. We have Loren Lippert to thank for his keen eye.

A number of members have contributed to this column with issues and photocopies. These include Stephan Filanovitch, William Graham, Yutaka Matsubayashi and Eiron Morgan.

On November 10, 1997 the **People's Republic of Korea** (North Korea) issued a set of three stamps which depict fencing, bowling and golf. A souvenir sheet with the same designs was issued at the same time. Both the stamps and the souvenir sheet exist imperforate also. Note the two non-denominated tabs or labels include golf as well as the other sports.





On December 3, 1997, **Cayman Islands** issued a set of four stamps, one of which shows Santa Claus playing golf (right).

**Guinea** has issued a sheetlet of 9 stamps honoring Frank Sinatra. The center stamp in the sheetlet shows Sinatra with golf club in hand. The sheetlet was issued early in 1998 and exists imperforate as well (below).




# POSTAL STATIONERY

**Norfolk Island** issued an aerogramme on January 27, 1998. The designer was the Norfolk Post and Mary Butterfield. It has a value of 75 cents, was printed by Mercury Walch Ltd. in a quantity of 15,000. The left side panel features a female golfer teeing off at the first hole, which carries a Par 4. In the stamp area there is an unfortunate male golfer attempting to drive out of a Bunker. The reverse of the Aerogramme has photographs of some of Norfolk Island's tourist attractions.

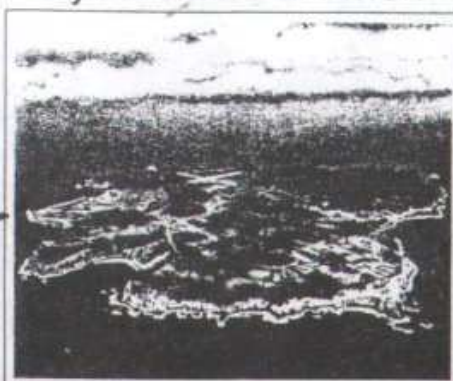
## AEROGRAMME By Air Mail Par Avion

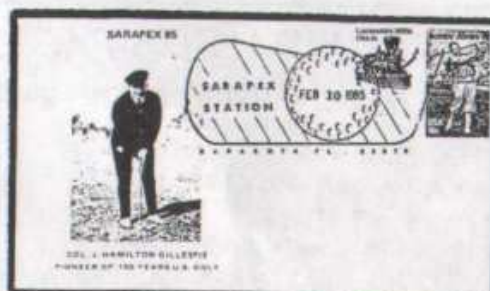


An aerial view of Norfolk Island

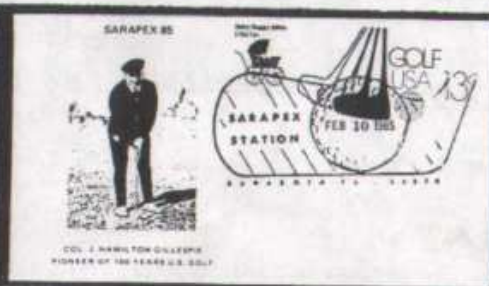

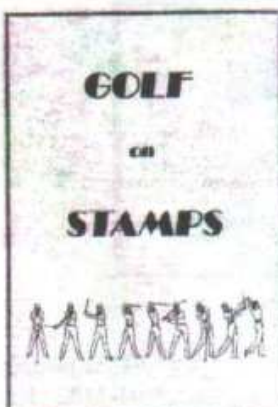
