



FRONT POSTCARD

This card from the linen era features the Club House of the beautiful Pasadena Golf Course located in St. Petersburg, Florida. According to the message side, the course is operated by the City Recreation Department which would indicate it was a public course.

Curteich of Chicago produced the card which was also made to be a score card where an individual could record his or her golf score. The scores on this one appear to have been copied from another source since they are all neatly written in ink. The card was canceled January 1, 1949 and the sender begins his greeting with a Happy New Year.

GOLF STAMPS FROM ANGOLA

The following information was extracted from a letter received from the Republica de Angola, Ministerio dos Correios E Telecomunicacoes in response to a letter of inquiry written by Yutaka Matsubayashi, a member of IPGS.

As reference to your letter dated September 15, 1999, be informed that our country has not issued golf stamps.

These stamps are fraud and have not any commercial or postal value.

We have already informed the U.P.U. and FIP.

If any of our other members have contacted other philatelic agencies regarding stamp issues, we would be most happy to print those responses as well.

OLYMPHILEX 2000



25-28 September 2000 Olympic Stamp, Numinmatic and Memorabilia Exhibition

This is a reminder of the competitive philatelic exhibition to be held in conjunction with the summer Olympics to be held in Sydney, Australia. OLYMPHILEX 2000 will be held at the Centrepoint Tower Ballroom from Thursday September 15 through Tuesday, September 28, 2000.

This is an all sports exhibition and will feature two levels of competition. The international class will be judged by the same standards as any other international or FIP competition. In addition, there is a category comparable to our national competitions. This will allow exhibitors that have not qualified internationally to participate in the Olympic event. The deadline for entering was February 15 so we hope you have already submitted your application if you had planned to do so.

If you are planning to attend the Olympics, please make a point to visit this multi-cultural event which will also feature coin and memorabilia exhibits.

Again, I would like to publish the names and titles of the exhibits to be entered in OLYMPHILEX 2000. Any members attending the games in Sydney will have an opportunity to stop by and view the exhibits. If anyone plans on attending, I would be most happy to hear from you and arrange a time and place to meet.

Unless we have some submittals for the June issue, you should expect to receive an issue containing several less pages—probably eight instead of the normal twelve.



A LITTLE POSTAL HISTORY

It's always fun to find a "golf cover" which of course can be many different things. The cover pictured below was purchased because of the label which was attached. However, in looking at the cover, one discovers it was sent as soldier's mail during World War II, postmarked October 4, 1942 or 1943 (unclear). Hence the free franking. Next we note that it was censored by a captain in the infantry—properly stamped and signed. The letter was sent through the U.S. Army Postal Service (APO #541). This cover would be considered a patriotic since the reverse side is an American flag.















SPECIAL EVENT--PUBLICITY COVERS FOR ST. PETERSBURG, FLORIDA

In addition to the cacheted air mail covers of the 1930s, special event covers were prepared for almost any reason at all. St. Petersburg, Florida appears to be a city which took advantage of many opportunities to promote the city and the many attractions available—golf being an available sport.

The first cover was produced for the 42nd Session, Supreme Council of M.O.V.P.ER, June 2, 3, 4, 1931. While the same rubber-stamp cachet design was used all three days, different colors of ink were used for each day. June 2 was blue, June 3 was salmon and June 4 was purple. All three of the covers were mailed at the air mail rate of 5 cents. The reverse of the June 3rd cover says from the Air Mail Society of St. Petersburg,





Another special event cover commemorates the 156th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence and is postmarked July 4, 1932. Golf appears on the inside stuffer. The reverse of



the stuffer reads "Compliments of the Aviation Department, Chamber of Commerce, St. Petersburg". York Briddell was the Chairman of the project. The cover was serially numbered 4301 which would indicate several thousand were prepared for the event.



The final special event cover was prepared to welcome H.M.S. Danae. This cover was franked with 2 cents in U.S. postage and a one penny Great Britain stamp. It is postmarked March 21, 1935. This cover was also sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce. On the reverse side the name Y. Briddell appears and it is serially numbered 1218.



NEW ISSUES

Four new stamp issues are being reported in this issue. Many other "stamps" or "seals" or "fakes" have been issued over the past year. However, unless we have some assurance that they are or were valid for postage in the country of origin, they will not be reproduced in this column. Our apologies for the Angola item which appeared on page 9 of the September 1999 issue.

Brunei: August 7, 1999

A set of ten stamps depicting different sports were issued for the 20th Sea Games held in 1999. The stamps were issued in two strips of five se-tenant stamps. We are only showing the one strip which has the golf stamp, second from the left.











Nevis:

Late 1999

A souvenir sheet was issued featuring the Four Seasons Resort on the island of Nevis in the West Indies. The souvenir sheet is made up of four stamps--the first or left stamp provides an aerial view of the Resort which shows the golf course in the background behind the buildings. The third stamp from the left is a close up view of one fairway and green.



Turkey:

September 19, 1999

A set of four stamps was issued for tourism. One of the four stamps shows a golfer on the well-manicured Belek Golf Club in Antalya.



Netherland Antilles:


