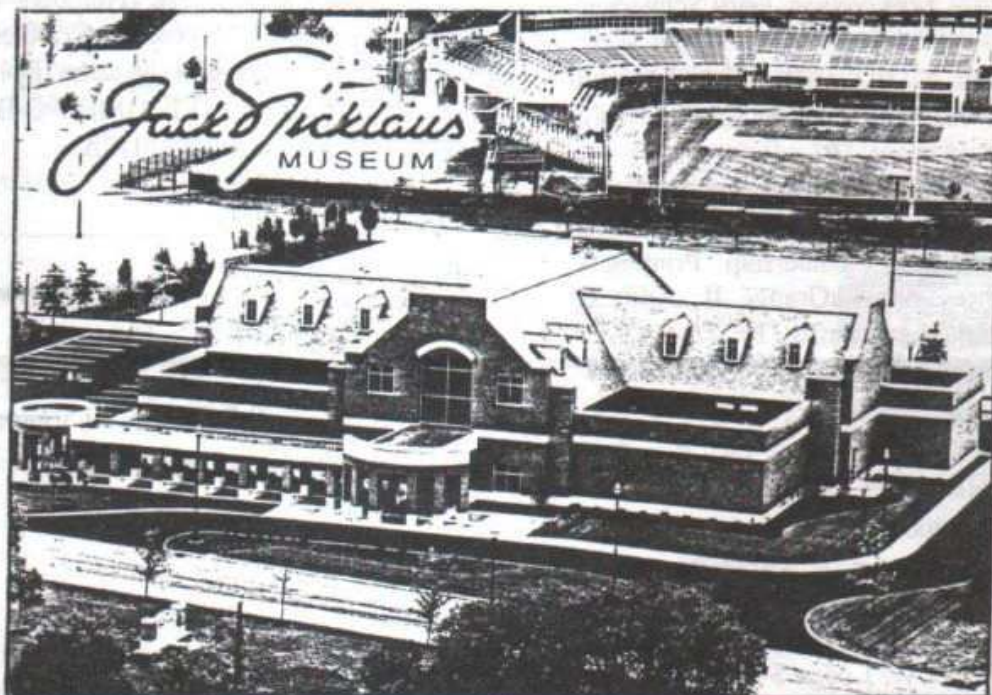
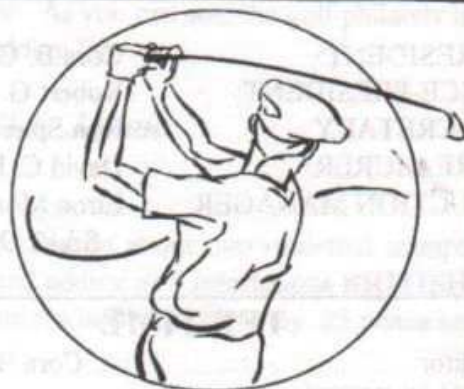

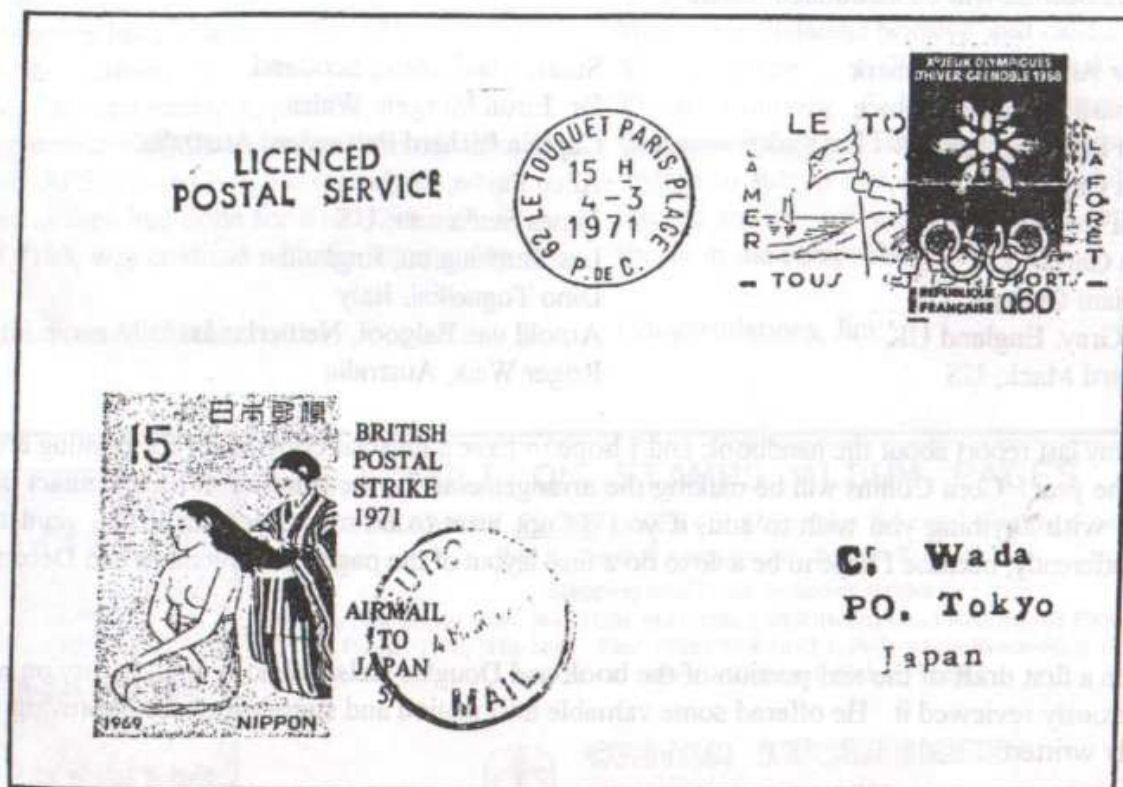

### **1971 British Postal Strike Airmail to Japan**

In JP 56/230 (December 2001), William M. Collyer asked for information about two rouletted stamps reproducing Japan's 1969.4.20 Y15 Philatelic Week stamp design and adding new inscriptions **BRITISH POSTAL STRIKE 1971 AIRMAIL TO JAPAN** and new denominations in British currency: 25 pence on one, 5 shillings on the other.

The British postal service was on strike from 20 January to 8 March 1971. The British government suspended the monopoly on mail delivery and granted 200 licenses to private companies to print stamps and deliver the mail. Mail to other countries was hand carried on the ferry across the English Channel to France, Belgium, or the Netherlands, to be franked with that country's postage and sent on to the final destination. The stamps reported by Mr. Collyer were issued by a company called **Public Mail Service** for use on airmail to Japan, using the design of Japan's 1969 Philatelic-Week stamp showing the 1931 painting by Kobayashi Kokei (1883-1957) titled simply "Kami" [Hair]. I have the 5/- lilac stamp used on cover as shown below.



The Public Mail Service firm affixed a **LICENCED POSTAL SERVICE** handstamp (top left) and its 5/- stamp (lower left) tied by a blue circular cancel reading **EUROPA MAIL 4 MARCH 1971**. A French stamp at top right has a **62 LE TOUQUET PARIS PLACE** circular cancel also dated 4 March 1971. The handstamped address is simply "C. Wada / PO, Tokyo / Japan".



## I.P.G.S. Meter Stamp Handbook

Since the report on this project in the June, 2002 *Tee Time*, I have received an abundance of meter copies and information for the handbook. Each of the contributors deserves a special mention. Stuart MacKenzie from Scotland who many of us will remember as the first and long-time editor of *Tee Time* sent a few hundred meter copies, mostly from Great Britain and France. He mentioned in his letter that he is still having health problems, so he made an extra special effort considering his current situation. John Capers III from the United States sent copies of some covers he had acquired from the husband of an IPGS member who had passed away. Even though Karen Elder's meters were mostly from the 1980s, many of them were new additions. Bernard Bergeret from France identified the date of EKU (earliest known use) for France and sent copies of almost 300 French meters. He sent 59 pages of meters in excellent color along with a copy of the table he uses to list his meters. Captain Richard Pattenden from Australia sent some wonderful and clear copies of his meters.

These additional hundreds of meters have given me a considerable challenge to get them sorted, organized and listed.

This will be my last report about the handbook and I hope to have a finished copy ready for printing around the end of the year. Cora Collins will be making the arrangements for the printing. Please contact me by October 30 with anything you wish to add, if you do not want to be mentioned, or if you want to be mentioned differently, because I hope to be able to do a final layout of the pages in November and December.

I have written a first draft of the text portion of the book and Douglas Kelsey who is an authority on meter stamps generously reviewed it. He offered some valuable information and suggestions for improving what I had already written.

France – June 19, 1936  
Great Britain – April 19, 1930  
United States – December 21, 1934

Australia – April 22, 1949  
Germany – December 5, 1936  
Italy – May 13, 1931



United States PGA – November 13, 1956  
Shell's Wonderful World of Golf – May 23, 1961

Do you have any earlier meters? My question about meter colors has been answered. Many countries have produced meter impressions in several colors – not just the United States.

Eiron Morgan submitted a copy of a text only slogan meter that reads – Britain's Best Bunkers Three Bees – dated November 27, 1933. Eiron noted that he doubts that "Bunkers" refers to golf. Can anyone provide any information about this meter?

If you have anything else to offer for the book, please get it to me soon as I will work to meet the deadlines I have set. Once again I want to extend my thanks for your interest in this project and hope we will all have a copy of it sometime in 2003.

## APS NUMBER 200,000

Our member, #451 Michael P. Kelly, had recently been reinstated after returning to the States. ## NEW ISSUES

While the stamps and booklet were issued June 28, 1997 for the Jersey Island Games, none of us picked up on the references to golf in the booklet. Scott lists the stamps as Jersey 800-805, however the booklet is not listed. Stanley Gibbons lists the stamps as 818-823 but only lists the booklet in their Channel Islands Catalogue as SB 55.

While golf is not one of the sports featured on the set of stamps, it is listed as one of the sports which would be played during the Jersey Island Games.

The Island Games Association includes the communities of Aland, Alderney, the Falklands, the Faroes, Froya, Gibraltar, Gotland, Greenland, Guernsey, Hitra, Iceland, Jersey, the Orkneys, Shetland, the Isle of Man, the Isle of Wight, Saaremaa, Sark, Prince Edward Island, Ynys Mon and St. Helena. The Island Games started in 1985 and now communities bid to host the Games which are held every two years.

The interleaves of the booklet present a brief history of the Island Games. According to this history golf was added to the competition in 1991 when the 4th Island Games were held in Aland. Golf is mentioned on two of the interleaves

# Jersey Island Games 1997

Guernsey was the venue for the second Island Games, which were held in September 1987. The 15 original member islands competed, together with teams from Alderney, Sark and Gibraltar.

Archery, indoor bowls and table tennis were added to the list of sports, but there was no soccer competition. However, the Games proved to have grown to such an extent that a total of 1,049 sportsmen and women, including officials, took part. For the second time in succession, the winning team came from the Isle of Man.

The third Games were held in July 1989 in the Faroe Islands, which lie between Shetland and Iceland. A team from Greenland participated for the first time and soccer (the full 11-a-side version rather than the five-a-side game which featured in the Isle of Man) reappeared in the programme. The bowls competition was dropped, but judo and gymnastics were introduced for the first time. The Isle of Man pulled off a hat-trick, again winning the team trophy. June 1991 saw the fourth Games open on the Finnish islands of Åland.

Newcomers to the Games were Saaremaa, an island which lies off Estonia, and Canada's Prince Edward Island. There was also an observer from the Falklands in the southern Atlantic. Golf and tennis were played for the first time, a record 1,500 athletes and officials took part in the spectacular opening ceremony, and Åland emerged as the winning team after much tough but friendly competition.

The success of Jersey's athletes in the 1993 event in the Isle of Wight and in 1995 in Gibraltar, where they won 37 gold medals, 32 silver and 34 bronze – an Island Games record total of 103 – means that they are keenly looking forward to competing at home between 28th June and 4th July 1997 for the 7th Island Games. It is expected that as many as 4,000 competitors, officials and spectators will visit Jersey for the '97 Games and that they will take part in a range of sports which will include athletics, soccer, cycling, tennis, table-tennis, golf, sailing, windsurfing, swimming, archery, badminton, volleyball, gymnastics, small-bore full-bore and pistol shooting, plus clay pigeon shooting. The scale of the 1997 Games means that they will be the largest sports event held in Britain & the year.

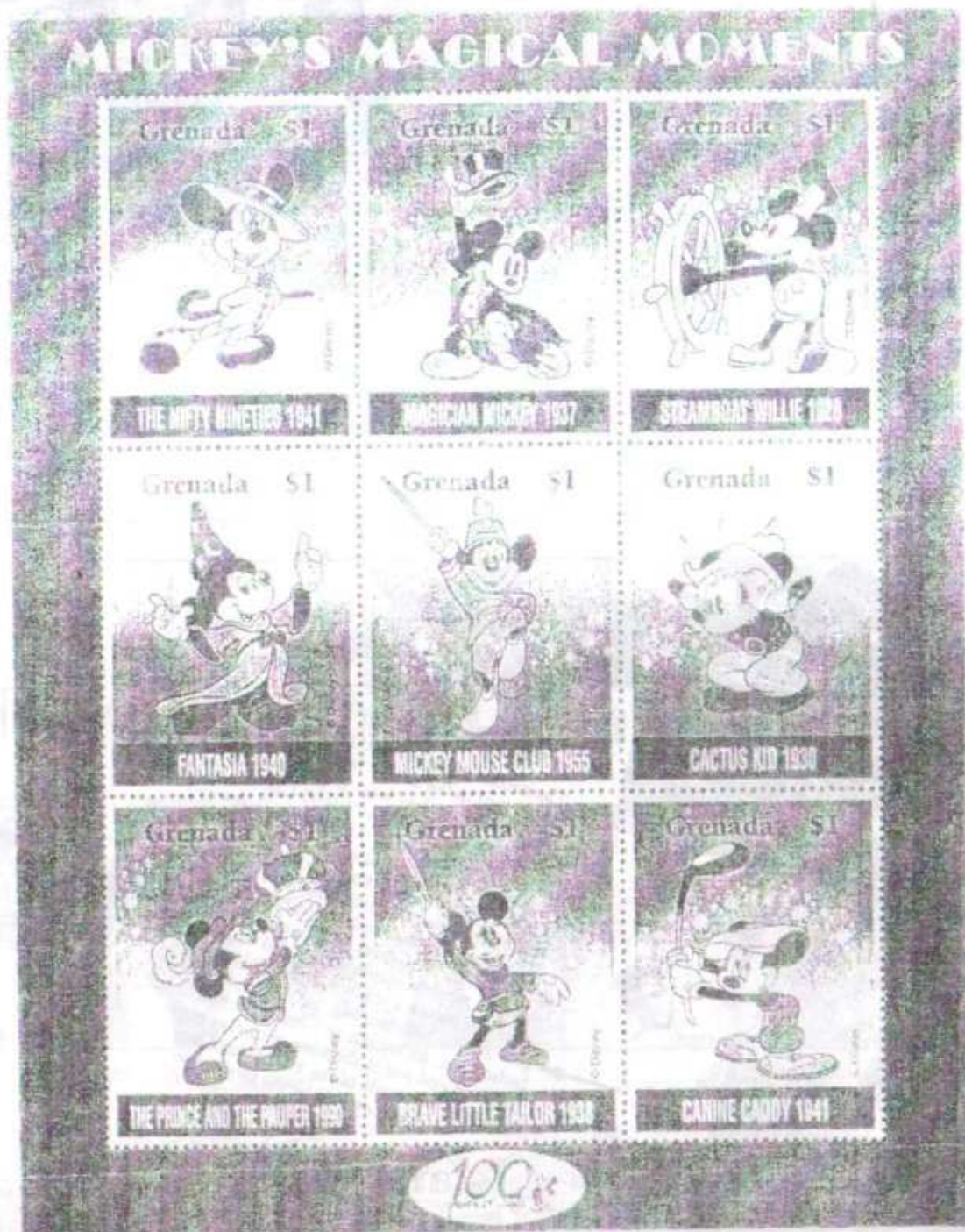

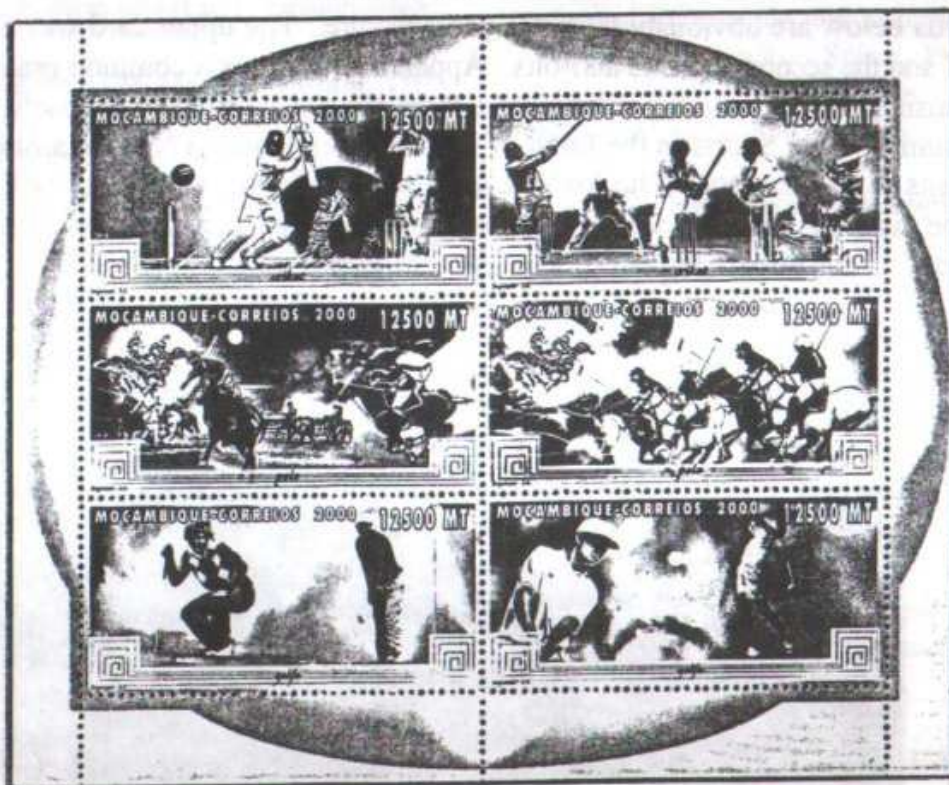

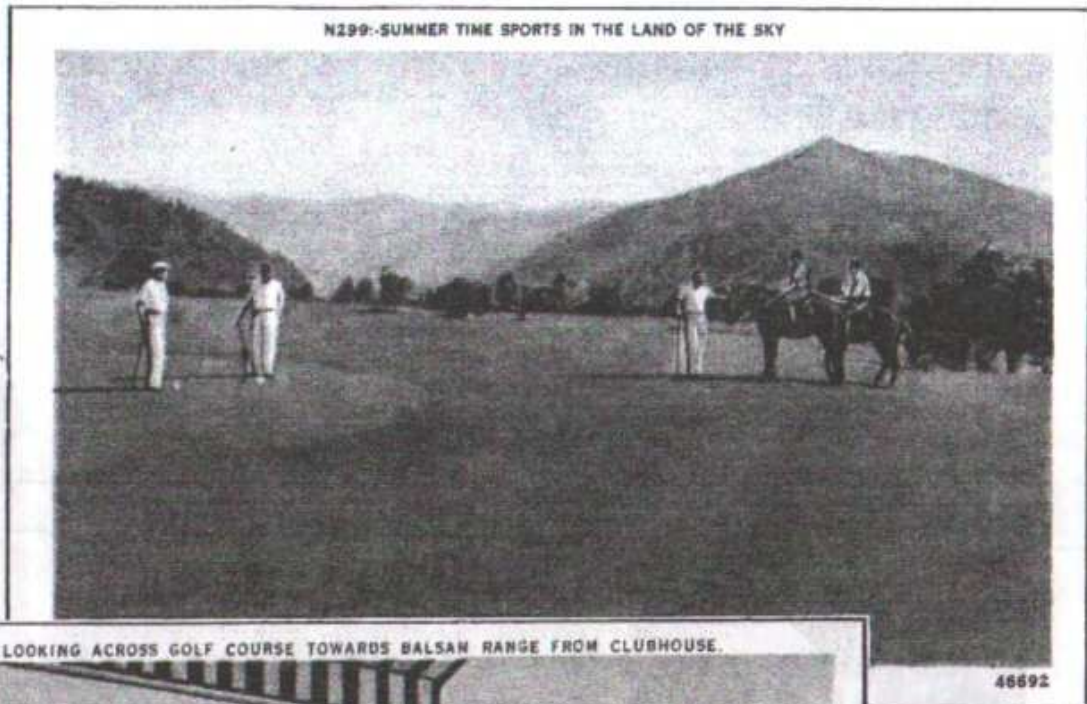
