LOTTIE DOD

BRITISH SPORTSWOMAN LOTTIE DOD WAS ONE OF THE MOST VERSATILE ATHLETES OF ALL TIME. APART FROM TAKING A SILVER MEDAL FOR ARCHERY IN 1908, DOD ALSO WON WIMBLEDON FIVE TIMES, A NATIONAL GOLF TITLE AND HELPED TO FOUND THE ENGLAND WOMEN'S NATIONAL FIELD HOCKEY TEAM.

CHARLOTTE (LOTTIE) DOD - BORN 24 SEPTEMBER 1871, DIED 27 JUNE 1960. AS WELL AS BEING 5 TIMES WIMBLEDON TENNIS CHAMPION SHE WON THE LADIES BRITISH OPEN AMATEUR GOLF TITLE BEATING MAY HEZLET 1 UP AT ROYAL TROON IN 1904. SHE ALSO WAS A MEMBER OF THE VICTORIOUS TEAM (6-1) VERSUS AMERICA IN 1905 - THE FORE RUNNER OF THE CURTIS CUP. GUINNESS BOOK OF RECORDS NAMED HER AS THE MOST VERSATILE ATHLETE OF ALL TIME ALONG WITH BABE ZAHARIAS.

GREENWICH, Conn. (AP)—The second round of match play in the women's metropolitan golf championship today found all of the favorites still in the running.

Maureen Orcutt of the White Beeches Club, Bayworth, N. J., title-holder for the past three years, indicated in the first round yesterday that she is not going to surrender the title without a fight. She crushed Mrs. Lloyd Wimpfheimer, Century Club, under an 8 and 1 score.

Helen Hicks of Hempstead, favored to meet Miss Orcutt in the final, was carried to the home green by Mrs. Arnold Jackson of Greenwich. Mrs. Lee Federman of Glen Oaks, another of the favorites, easily defeated Mrs. Henry Marsh of North Shore, 4 and 2. Katherine Reed, Montclair, N. J., had the hardest job of all to get into the second round, beating Howells Knapp, women's national, only after a Century hole of play.

Quinta Serra Golf

The Quinta Serra Golf is a cottage-style manor built in 1923 by Tiago Agular. In 1935 it was sold as a teahouse, later becoming the Golf Club clubhouse to the spectacular 27 hole Santo da Serra Golf Course (official home for the Madeira Open Tournament). As the Estalagem is an associate member of the Santo da Serra Golf Club its guests are guaranteed starting times, hire of golf equipment and even a 30 per cent discount in green fees.

In 2000 it underwent a new refurbishing ordered by the current proprietors who transformed it into a tourist inn - Estalagem Serra Golf. The Estalagem is situated in the picturesque village of Santo da Serra, surrounded by an important and dense woodland, part of the marvellous 'laurissilva' forest, and was classified as world heritage in 1999. The proximity to the 'levadas' (water courses) and 'veredas' (footpaths) of Madeira permits lovely and unforgettable walking. The beach of Santa Cruz and the airport are only 10 minutes away, and Funchal is within a mere 20 minutes.

This Madeira island hotel with 18 standard rooms, 2 junior suites and an apartment, was opened on March 12, 2001 and has already accommodated numerous golfers of international prestige as well as PGA members.

In many countries golf is regarded as an elite sport, particularly as golf courses require expanses of land, often in urban areas. In Australia plentiful space and our sporting culture has ensured a strong following of the sport. Both the Australian Golf Club in Sydney and the Royal Melbourne Golf Club can lay claim to being the oldest golf club in the country. While the Australian was founded in 1882 it did not operate between 1888 and 1895. Royal Melbourne, although founded later on in 1891, has been in continuous operation, making it the longest functioning club. Despite their longevity, neither club can claim to be the oldest golf course in Australia. The Bothwell course in Tasmania was established in 1839, and may well have been the first golf course in the Southern Hemisphere. The Bothwell Golf Club was formally established in 1902 and is still in operation.

A highlight of the 2011 Australian golfing year will be the hosting of The Presidents Cup at Royal Melbourne in November. The Presidents Cup is a biennial series of matches between a US team and an international team representing the rest of the world outside Europe. It is hosted alternatively in the US and in countries represented by the international team. Royal Melbourne, which also hosted the cup in 1998, has the distinction of being the only course outside the USA to host the cup more than once. Throughout its 17-year history, the world's greatest players have participated, including Greg Norman, Fred Couples, Arnold Palmer, Peter Thomson, Jack Nicklaus, Gary Player and Tiger Woods. Despite the competition, the spirit of The Presidents Cup is one of international harmony and understanding. With no prize money directly awarded to the competitors, each competitor allocates an equal portion of the funds generated to charities of his choice. Since the event's inception in 1994, nearly \$22 million has been raised for charities worldwide.

The theme for the Christmas 2011 stamp issue was 'Winter Wonderland' and earlier in the year the Philatelic Bureau ran a photographic competition. The response was fantastic, with some truly spectacular images submitted. The winning shot came from Mr Nigel Byrom who wowed the judges with his stunning image of a snowy L'Ancrese Common (36p). The judges also selected six runners up whose photographs were used on the remaining stamps in this Winter Wonderland Christmas issue.
