The first card (Figure 23) is the same basic card two and is printed in very bright colors. "Winter Golf" is printed on the upper right in red-orange. This card has the same cloud formations as the one in figure 13 (issue #102). This card was mailed from Phoenix Ariz on July 16, 1960 which seems to prove that it was printed for sale in Arizona. It is also the earliest known card that I have in this series in my collection.

The back of the card has the S-14737-B control number from Dexter Press, figure 24. Genuine Natural Color Made By DEXTER PRESS, INC., West Nyack, N.Y. is printed as the center divider.

Bob Petley (Robert Teeple Petley), born November 11, 1912 and died on July 7, 2006. In 1943 he moved to Arizona where he was employed by the Arizona Republic and Gazette and was on the staff in the display advertising department. He stayed with the newspaper for three years. Bob could foresee a market for tourist postcards when the wartime travel restrictions were lifted.

He left the newspaper and started his own postcard company. His first designs were a set of twelve black and white humorous postcards. He named the company, Petley Studios, Inc.

Bob Petley always had a camera with him. He would drive a Lincoln Continental station wagon down the highways of Arizona and take pictures. He removed the backseat from the station wagon and replaced it with several sets of racks of postcards. As he combed the state for images, he stopped at souvenir shops selling his postcards.

Eventually, Petley Studios, Inc. would become the nations largest publisher and distributor of scenic color postcards, with an annual sales exceeding 25,000,000 cards selling through 3500 dealers in Arizona, West Texas, New Mexico, eastern California and southwestern Colorado. He also owned retail stores in Silverton and Ouray Colorado.

Many of his postcards are now in display at the Smithsonian Institute. He sold his business in 1984 to Bruce Finchum, owner of Smith-Southwestern Inc. Postcard wholesaler and calendars, books etc. 8 TEE TIME
